# DR. PAUL MEEK . and History of UTMB

Dr. Paul Meek, vice-president of The University of Tennessee and Chancellor of the Martin Branch, has been head of the institution many years. He completed his graduate work and undergraduate studies at U-T Knoxville where he achieved membership in the academic fraternity, Phi Kappa Phi. He has earned recognition over the state as an educational leader.

Dr. Meek has served as president of the Tennessee College Association and is a member of the State and National Education Association. An active participant in local affairs, he is a past president of the Martin Rotary Club and a member of the Weakley County Chamber of Commerce.



For a number of years Dr. Meek has been an active member and lay leader in his church. At the present time he is a member of the General Board of Education of the Methodist Church in the United States. Lambuth College a few years ago awarded him the honorary degree of doctor of laws.

During his tenure of office as administrative head, Dr. Meek has seen the annual enrollment of UTMB grow from less than 100 to an expected 3000 this fall. An enthusiastic booster of football, as well as all athletics, he continually strives to become personally acquainted with as many players as possible and never misses a home game.

UTMB, an institution with which Dr. Meek's name will always be associated, is located in the northwestern part of the state. It is situated about halfway between historic, earthquake formed Reelfoot Lake and Kentucky-Tennessee Lake, the latter being one of the largest man-made bodies of water in the United States. The main campus of UTMB includes 100 acres of beautifully wooded land on state highway 22 which is four-laned through the campus to the western limits of Martin.

In 1951, UTMB was made a degree-granting institution by legislative enactment and its name was changed to The University of Tennessee Martin Branch. Now, in the summer of 1967 the University will initiate a master's degree program. At the present time the school is rapidly growing. Three new buildings have been completed in the past year. The increased enrollment has created the need for a number of additional buildings, which are now under construction. Married student apartments, and a stadium are new acquisitions.

Degrees are offered in liberal arts, agriculture, business administration, education and home economics. In addition to these degrees, two years of journalism and basic engineering are available.



# JAMES C. HENSON

#### Athletic Director

James C. Henson has served as athletic director of UTMB since 1957. Prior to that time he served as football coach for nine years. Professor Henson also serves as director of physical education and health and for a number of years has been the UTMB Vols tennis coach.

Prof. Henson was born in Okolona, Mississippi, and lived in the near vicinity for a number of years. While attending Mississippi State he earned four letters in football and three in track. He was a starting tackle on the Maroon team of 1935 that defeated Alabama's Rose Bowl team and Army's hitherto undefeated team. He captained the track team his senior year at State.

Prof. Henson coached high school football in Alabama and Mississippi for a short time and served as head coach of the football team at Mississippi Junior College. Upon coming to UTMB in 1946, he was made assistant to coach Paul Hug, and the following year took the reins as head coach. He filled the position of basketball coach from 1947 until 1952 and then in 1957 was elevated to his present position as athletic director.

Prof. Henson received the bachelor of science degree from Mississippi State and later the master of science degree in education there. He also earned the master of arts degree in health and physical education at Alabama.

Following the successful drive for the new football stadium in 1964, the completion of the new Physical Education Building in 1963, and the institution of expanded programs in health education, he and his staff have now completed the first major success story in spring sports with both the golf and tennis teams losing only three matches, while also taking the runnerup position in the conference golf tourney. Lighting facilities for the tennis courts have been provided and construction of additional tennis courts near the new physical education building has been completed.

Thus, with the help of Prof. Henson, athletics, intramurals, and campuswide sports have continually been expanded to coincide with the university's expanded growth.

# ROBERT L. CARROLL

Head Coach

Robert L. Carroll begins his tenth season as head football coach at UTMB this fall. Coming to the institution on his first coaching job following graduation, he has brought bigtime football to this growing division of the university and by the record he has compiled has proven that he is not only a winning coach, but a progressive and accomplished one.



In the past nine seasons, his teams have won 47 games, lost 31, and tied two. He lost one game during his first two seasons at UTMB, and with his youthful knowledge of the game, he has introduced advanced football techniques and thus provided a better football program. Opponents played by the team under his leadership have risen year by year in caliber and size.

In 1957, Coach Carroll came to Martin after an outstanding career as a player at UTMB and at the University of Wyoming. At UTMB Carroll was named most valuable player both years and was captain his second year. Playing under Phil Dickens at Wyoming, Carroll was a starting back of the 1956 team that defeated Texas Tech in the Sun Bowl.

Carroll's football playing did not interfere with his studies. In 1954 he was named to the Academic All-America team. He graduated from Wyoming with honors, one of which was being named to membership in the national honorary psychology fraternity, Psi Chi. He served in the Marine Corps during 1951 and 1952, and was discharged with the rank of sergeant. He is a native of Milan, Tennessee.

Carroll prefers a high-scoring team both on the field and in the classroom. He pays strict attention to the academic status of his men. His first requirement on the field is that his men show down-to-earth hard-nosed play, and consequently he has always fielded teams strong on defense.



# **GROVER PAGE**

#### Defensive Line Coach

One of UTMB's strongest points is that of defense, and Grover Page has played an important role in that development since his arrival at UTMB in 1959.

His work has increased the strength of the UTMB Vols through both grid knowledge of college line-play and recruiting in the South. Responsible for much of the scouting in South Carolina, Georgia, Mississippi and Alabama, he has secured for UTMB numerous outstanding individuals. Aside from his duties, Page also finds time to coach the golf team.

A teammate of head coach Robert Carroll and end coach Ross Elder at Wyoming, he lettered two years and helped lead the Cowboys to first place in the Skyline Conference in 1956. This was the team that defeated Texas Tech in the Sun Bowl.

He attended Georgia Military College before transferring to Wyoming and there was named to the Junior College All-America team. A starting tackle at Georgia for both years, he earned Mid-South honors his sophomore year.

After being discharged from the Army in 1958, Page coached prep football and basketball at Aiken, South Carolina.



# ROSS ELDER

#### Offensive Line Coach

Currently in his eighth season as end coach on the UTMB Vol coaching staff, Ross Elder represents an integral part of a balanced group of tutors. In addition to his duties he is responsible for scouting prospective players in the northern areas of the nation.

A three-year letterman at Wyoming and a teammate of both head coach Robert Carroll and line coach Grover Page, he was unanimously selected to the All-Skyline Conference team his senior year. In 1956 he played in the Blue-Gray game in Montgomery, Alabama.

Elder coached high school football in Worland, Wyoming, before going to Indiana University. While working on his master's degree, he assisted Phil Dickens, his former coach, and also met UTMB's newest member of the coaching staff, Jack Beeler.

# JACK S. BEELER

#### Defensive Backfield Coach

The newest member of the Vol's coaching staff, Jack Beeler, begins his second season as the defensive backfield coach.

With several years of coaching experience, Beeler has accumulated a long list of credentials. Most recent of these is his work with Phil Dickens at Indiana where he has been since 1958. There he met and worked with end coach Ross Elder.

Before going to Indiana, Beeler coached high school football at Williamsburg, Kentucky, and then later at Oneida, Tenn., at the latter of which he had 10-0 records in both 1956 and 1957.

A native of Knoxville, Coach Beeler played tailback at Wofford College where he was listed as Most Valuable as well as being selected on the Little All-America team. While at Wofford he established the phenomenal feat of completing 26 of 31 pass attempts against Auburn, and he later played in the 1951 Blue-Gray game.



# **BOBBY FOWLER**

#### Freshman Coach

A Little All-American while performing for the Vols, Bobby played professional football, and is now doing additional academic work at UTMB.

Fowler will work primarily with the freshman backs and will serve as a scout.

# **JOHN JENKINS**

#### Freshman Coach

John was an outstanding center for the Vols. He will work mostly with the freshman linemen, and he will join Fowler for scouting duties.

Very active in the Reserve Officers Training Corps, Jenkins will enter service as a Second Lieutenant upon his graduation.

# OTHER PERSONNEL

# PAT MURDOCK (Trainer)

Pat will begin his second year as a trainer. He once participated as an active player and is familiar with injury problems arising from practice and game conditions. Murdock is a junior in education and hails from Honea Path, S. C.

# GARY McMAKIN (Equipment Manager)

Hailing from Tampa, Florida, it will be Gary's duty to issue and keep track of all equipment. In addition to these duties Gary will also make minor equipment repairs. McMakin is a sophomore in education.

# ROSS KOMICH (Field Manager)

Komich hails from Statesboro, Ga. and is an agriculture major. It is his task to maintain the sleds, dummies and other field equipment. In the off-season, Komich also finds time to be a member of the Vols golf team.

# BILL BENSON (Sports Information Director)

Benson, a junior in Liberal Arts, is serving his second year as sports information director. A co-ordinator for the publicity of all athletics, he was an all-round athlete in high school and football captain his junior and senior years. Benson was also an All-Conference linebacker his junior and senior years at Choctawhatchee High School in Ft. Walton Beach, Fla. He works with the local radio stations and newspapers and is the sports editor of The Volette and the annual. He works through the Athletic Department and in close cooperation with the Public Relations Office.

# 1966 FOOTBALL OUTLOOK

A major concern for the 1966 Volunteers, if 1965 was any indication, will be to avoid a slow start and a late season slump. The 1965 Vols played their best football during the middle of the season.

The 1966 Orangemen will have more experience, but a lack of depth at nearly every position will be an important factor. Several red shirts will be called upon to fill vital spots.

The ends are largely inexperienced. Among the offensive and defensive starters at the end of spring practice, there was only one letterman. Several young players show a lot of promise, but they lack seasoning.

The tackles have more speed than in 1965, and the depth here is more abundant. Three lettermen will be among the contenders at this spot.

More lettermen are to be found at the guard positions than in the other positions. Five returning lettermen give greater depth here.

Depth is again an important factor at center. Two lettermen return here. New prospects must supply the reserve depth.

A lack of height at the quarterback position is a major concern for the coaching staff. The quarterbacks have good speed and pass well, but tall defenders will pose a problem. This position is steadily improving.

Two lettermen return at the tailback spot. Both are proven performers, but a lack of reserves could be a problem.

The same situation exists at the fullback and wingback positions. Two lettermen return at each of these slots and red shirts must supply the bench strength.

The Volunteers appeared to be somewhat improved during the Orange-White spring game with the defensive unit showing a little more strength. The major improvement was in the kicking game. The Vols also appear to have more backfield speed.

"Our success in 1966 will depend to a great extent upon our willingness to improve and to avoid any slump during the season," Coach Carroll said.



# **GORDON LAMBERT**

End

Junior from Leckie, West Virginia . . . 6'5", 230 pounder, majoring in Physical Education. An All-Stater in high school, Lambert shows fine potential. A defensive standout in spring drills, Lambert has fine speed for a big man. Aggressiveness and mobility are his two biggest assets. Gordon is a top candidate for a defensive end assignment this fall.

# LARRY KROUSE

End

Sophomore letterman from Memphis, Tenn. . . . 6'1". 195 pounds, Krouse gained valuable experience as a freshman and won a starting slot last fall . . . though a solid defensive man, Krouse is best on offense . . . Larry possesses average speed, but works on perfection in faking and timing. An excellent receiver, Krouse has also steadily improved his blocking. Krouse was one of the Vols leading receivers last fall and will add experience to a position weakened by graduation.

# JULIAN NUNAMAKER

End

Sophomore from Manning, South Carolina . . . majoring in Secondary Education. A solid 6'3", 216 pounder, Julian has developed steadily both offensively and defensively. A letterman last year, Nunamaker has the size, strength, and desire to be a standout this fall. The coaching staff will expect much from Julian.

# **GARY WOOD**

End

Freshman in Education from Fort Walton Beach, Florida. An all-conference, all-county award winner in high school. . . . Wood's greatest asset is desire . . . A spry 6'1", 190 pounder, he was selected as the Most Improved Player following the spring game. With experience, Gary will see a lot of action at UTMB.

# RICHARD WHITFIELD

End

Hails from Macon, Georgia . . . Freshman in Physical Education . . The 6'1", 200 pounder was named to All-State Honors at Willingham High. Strong and quick, Richard lacks only game experience to complete his development. . . . Has the potential to become an outstanding pass receiver and is an excellent blocker.

# PIERCE BRAUN

End

Freshman from Sewichley, Penn. A redshirt last fall, Braun has good size, 6'1", 218 pounds, and speed. A Liberal Arts student, Pierce has good potential and could see action this year. With work and determination the big boy can go a long way.





# BILL POWELL

End

Freshman from Springfield, Tennessee . . . Selected all Mid-State in high school. 5'10'', 185 pounds, Powell makes up for lack of size in sheer desire. Likes to hit and moves well. Had a good spring and with additional size and experience, he could be a contender for a starting role.

# DALE STRICKLAND

End

Freshman from nearby Huntingdon. All-West Tennessee; Honorable Mention All-State are among his high school laurels . . . Majoring in Liberal Arts, Dale is 6'1", 198 pounds. A real hitter, he had an impressive spring and is fast developing into a solid defensive man.

End

#### Guard




