PLAYER TO WATCH

Cornerback JaMichael McGoy, Jr. has been tabbed as a consensus preseason All-American after a record-setting 2024 campaign. The Chattanooga, Tenn. native set a program single-season record with 18 pass breakups while ranking third nationally with 21 passes defended.

As a three-year starter, McGoy currently ranks tied for second in program history with 30 career passes defended, trailing only former teammate Oshae Baker (36) by six for the all-time record.

- >> The University of Tennessee at Martin football team will make its 2025 debut when traveling to Football Bowl Subdivision and Big 12 member Oklahoma State on Thursday, Aug. 28. Kickoff from Boone Pickens Stadium is slated for 6:30 p.m. and will be broadcast nationally on ESPN+.
- >> The Skyhawks enter the season coming off four consecutive conference championships - including back-to-back Ohio Valley Conference titles in 2021 and 2022 before clinching a share of back-to-back crowns in the OVC-Big South Football Association in 2023 and 2024. UT Martin has won 21 of its last 25 conference games while earning berths to the FCS Playoffs in 2021 and 2024 picking up postseason victories in both appearances.
- >> This marks the 96th season of football and 34th as a Division I program in 2025 for UT Martin. The Skyhawks are 40-52-2 in season openers in the program's history while playing FBS programs 11 times during the Jason Simpson Era.
- >> Thursday's contest marks the 31st matchup against a FBS program for the Skyhawks with the program picking up wins against Memphis (2012) and Kennesaw State (2024). The game marks the second matchup against a program from the Big 12 Conference – also playing Kansas State in the 2024 season opener – while the squad is tabbed to matchup against West Virginia (2026) and UCF (2027).
- >> Entering his 20th season on the sidelines, Skyhawk head coach Jason Simpson possesses a 124-92 career record. The two-time OVC Coach of the Year ranks third in league history in career victories while winning conference titles in 2006, 2021, 2022, 2023 and 2024.
- >> Oklahoma State is looking to bounce back in year 21 for head coach Mike Gundy after a disappointing season which saw the Cowboys boast a 3-9 overall record while going winless in the Big 12.
- >> Saturday's meeting marks the first matchup between the two programs in series history.

UT MARTIN PICKED TO FINISH SECOND IN OVC-BIG SOUTH FOOTBALL ASSOCIATION POLL

>> After winning four consecutive league championships, including a share of back-to-back OVC-Big South Football Association championship, UT Martin has been picked to finish second in the association's annual preseason poll. The Skyhawks received 56 points and two first place votes - finishing out point out of first place - to finish second.

FOUR STRAIGHT LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIPS

» Regardless of conference affiliation, UT Martin has won at least a share of four consecutive conference championships. The streak began with an outright Ohio Valley Conference title in 2021 before sharing another OVC title in 2022. After a conference merger with the Big South, the Skyhawks have claimed a piece of back-to-back Big South-OVC Football Association crowns in 2023 and 2024.

» UT Martin is the just the fifth program to win four or more consecutive titles in the OVC's history and only trails a five-year run by Jacksonville State from 2016-18

OVC SUPREMACY

» Since the 2006 season, UT Martin ranks as the winningest active member in the Ohio Valley Conference with 93 victories. After winning just 20 games in the team's first 14 years in the league, the Skyhawks are 93-50 since 2006 while sitting 19 wins above the closest program in Eastern Illinois (74-68) during that span. The Skyhawks have finished .500 or above in conference play in 17 of the last 19 seasons - including six top-two finishes.

SIMPSON MOVES UP TO THIRD ALL-TIME IN OVC

>> UT Martin head coach **Jason Simpson** currently sits third in OVC history with 124 career victories. With his win against Gardner-Webb on Oct. 5 he surpassed former Middle Tennessee coach Charles Murphy. Now in his 19th season at UTM, Simpson ranks as the longest tenured coach in the league while sitting first among active OVC coaches in victories.

>> This is the third season of the OVC-Big South Football Association. The Big South Conference and Ohio Valley Conference announced the creation of an association of their football member institutions that began play with the 2023 NCAA Division I football season. The modified agreement will now extend through at least 2030.

>> Schools in the association are Charleston Southern, Eastern Illinois, Gardner-Webb, Lindenwood, Southeast Missouri, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech, UT Martin and Western Illinois.



MCGOY CHASING PROGRAM PBU RECORD

>> Cornerback JaMichael McGoy, Jr. has proven to be an impact performer for the Skyhawks since he was a true freshman in 2021 and has soared up the program's record book for career passes defended with 30 breakups and five interceptions. McGoy currently sits second with 35 career passes defended - trailing former teammate Oshae Baker by 10.

THREE TEAMS FROM BIG SOUTH-OVC IN PLAYOFFS

>> Three members of the OVC-Big South Football Association earned bids to the 2024 NCAA Division I Football Championship. Southeast Missouri won the Association's automatic bid while both Tennessee State and UT Martin earned at-large bids. It marked just the second time that three members of the OVC have earned playoff bids - joining a group in 2013 which saw all three teams win their first round matchups.

SKYHAWKS SOARING UP NATIONAL POLLS

» UT Martin were ranked nationally in five weeks last season while receiving votes in the 11 of the 12 weeks of the regular season. The Skyhawks finished the season ranked No. 17 in the Stats Perform Top 25 and No. 18 in the AFCA Coaches' Poll.

MCGOY NAMED BUCK BUCHANAN AWARD FINALIST

» Cornerback **JaMichael McGoy, Jr.** is regarded as one of the best defensive players in the country after being named a finalist for the prestigious Buck Buchanan Award by Stats Perform. The 2025 Buck Buchanan Award celebrates its 31th anniversary season and is presented to the national defensive player of the year in Division I FCS college football. The award is named for legendary defensive lineman Junious "Buck" Buchanan, who starred at Grambling State as part of his Hall of Fame career.

» A 2024 first-team OVC-Big South selection, McGoy ranked third nationally with 1.5 pass breakups per game while leading the Association with 18 pass breakups. He also tallied three interceptions – including one featured on SportsCenter Top 10 with a one-handed snag against nationally ranked New Hampshire in the first round of the FCS playoffs. In total, he tallied 43 total tackles and three tackles for loss.

TENNESSEE TOUGH, MARTIN MADE

» Under the direction of head coach **Jason Simpson**, the Skyhawks have taken pride in winning games against in-state opponents. Since 2014, the Skyhawks have posted a 26-9 record against instate foes while possessing the second-best overall winning percentage of all Division I programs in the state (FBS and FCS) since 2010 at 57.0 percent.

SEASON 96

>> The 2025 campaign is UT Martin's 96th season of football despite suspending play during Great Depression (1933) and World War II (1942-45). The Skyhawks are in their 33rd season at the NCAA Division I FCS level. UT Martin joined the NCAA Division I ranks in 1992 and have compiled an overall record of 152-212 with two Ohio Valley Conference titles (2006 and 2021), two OVC-Big South titles (2023 and 2024) and three NCAA Playoff appearance (2006, 2021 and 2024) as a Division-I program.

EIGHT SKYHAWKS NAMED BIG SOUTH-OVC PRESEASON PLAYERS TO WATCH LIST

>> Eight Skyhawk were named to the OVC-Big SouthFootball Association Preseason Player to Watch List. The Skyhawk group includes five players on offense, two on defense and one specialist. The team was headlined by quarterback Jase Bauer, running back Armoni Goodwin, wide receiver Phaizon Wilson, tight end Drake Martinez, offensive lineman Josiah Tingley, linebacker Tah Mac Bright Banda, defensive back JaMichael McGoy, Jr. and punter Jaren Van Winkle.

FIVE SKYHAWKS EARN SPOT ON PHIL STEELE PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE LIST

» A total of five UT Martin football players garnered spots on the annual Phil Steele Preseason All-OVC-Big South teams. The preseason all-conference teams consisted of three groupings with UT Martin claiming two first team honors, two second team selections and one third team pick.

» Earning a spot on the first team was offensive lineman Josiah Tingley and defensive back JaMichael McGoy, Jr. Garnering second team recognitions was the defensive duo of linebacker Tah Mac Bright Banda and safety Josh Hastings. The third team was rounded out by running back Armoni Goodwin.

HOME SWEET HOME

>> UT Martin has found success at Hardy Graham Stadium with three unbeaten campaigns in the last four years. Additionally, the Skyhawks have won 25 of their last 30 contests at home since 2019 - including a 18-3 record over the past four seasons. Against Big South-OVC opponents, the Skyhawks have lost just one game since Apr. 3, 2020 - a record of 13-1.

The longest tenured head football coach in the Ohio Valley Conference is Jason Simpson, who has transformed the University of Tennessee at Martin program into one of the winningest teams in the OVC since his first season in 2006.

In 19 years, Simpson has led UT Martin to an 124-92 record (.574 winning percentage) and a 93-50 mark against conference opponents (.650 winning percentage). That comes after the program had won 20 OVC games in its first 14 seasons in the league. He also has presided over 174 all-conference players after the program tallied 33 such players in its first 15 seasons in the OVC.

Simpson's 124 career victories rank third in OVC history while his 93 conference wins also sit in third place – with both totals only trailing Roy Kidd (Eastern Kentucky) and Boots Donnelly (Austin Peay/Middle Tennessee). Included in those victories are two wins over Football Bowl Subdivision programs with upset victories against Memphis (2012, 20-17) and Kennesaw State (2024, 24-13).

Six of the program's 10 8-win seasons have come under Simpson, including all six at the Football Championship Subdivision level. He is responsible for the program's only OVC championship teams in 2006, 2021, 2022, 2023 and 2004. The 2006 team ended the season ranked No. 13 nationally with a 9-3 record while the 2021 team won the first playoff game in the Division I Era and finished the campaign ranked No. 12 nationally with a 10-3 overall mark. The Skyhawks completed back-to-back league titles with a 2022 championship after going 7-4 overall while posting the program's first unbeaten conference slate with a 5-0 record. The squad then rattled off a three-peat in the inaugural season of the Big South-OVC Football Association with an 8-3 overall mark while going 5-1 in league action. The program then became just the fifth in OVC history to win four or more consecutive titles after boasting a 9-5 record and advancing to the second round of the FCS playoffs.

Simpson is a four-time finalist for the Eddie Robinson FCS Coach of the Year Award in 2006, 2012, 2016 and 2021 while finishing fourth overall in 2006. He is also a two-time recipient of the OVC's Roy Kidd Coach of the Year award in 2006 and 2021 while being named the American Football Coaches Association Region 3 Coach of the Year in 2006, his debut season at UT Martin.

A total of 41 Skyhawks have been named an All-American under Simpson. A collection of those players include Alex Atkins (2006), Oshae Baker (2024), Tony Bell (2013, 2014), Josh Bey (2009), Jessie Burton (2006), Jeremy Butler (2013), Drake Carroll (2024), Don Chapman (2006), Daylan Dotson (2022), Christian Dowell (2024), CJ Estelle (2011), John H. Ford II (2022), Joe Gibbs (2009), Matthan Hatchie (2021, 2022), Montori Hughes (2012), Chris Hunter, Jr. (2024), Ben Johnson (2013), JaMichael McGoy, Jr. (2024), Dontrell

Miller (2008), Charles Perkins (2023, 2024), Brock Powers (2022), Jaylon Sharpe (2024), Quentin Sims (2012), Vance Van Every (2024), Ray Williams (2008), Rodney Williams II (2020), Terry Williams (2019) and Josh Yarbrough (2007).

Simpson has also overseen the development of seven major award winners, 74 all-conference first team honorees, 80 second team selections and 20 OVC All-Newcomer picks. The Skyhawks have had two OVC Offensive Players of the Year in Don Chapman (2006) and Keon Howard (2021) and one OVC Defensive Player of the Year with John H. Ford II (2022). He also oversaw the development of Big South-OVC Special Teams Player of the Year Aidan Laros during the 2023 campaign. They have also boasted three OVC Freshmen of the Year honorees in Don Chapman (2004), John Bachus III (2019) and Sam Franklin (2022).

Two Skyhawks have been drafted during the Simpson Era with wide receiver Colton Dowell (2023) and defensive tackle Montori Hughes (2012) hearing their names called on the final day of their respective drafts. Hughes was taken in the fifth round (139th pick) of the 2012 NFL Draft by the Indianapolis Colts while Dowell was selected in the seventh round (228th pick) in 2023 by the Tennessee Titans.

The program had a shining moment in 2023 when three former Skyhawks earned spots on active NFL rosters with Dowell (Tennessee Titans), Rodney Williams II (Pittsburgh Steelers) and Dresser Winn (Los Angeles Rams) representing UT Martin. Since 2011, Gibbs (St. Louis Rams, Green Bay Packers), Sims (Atlanta Falcons, New England Patriots), Derek Carr (New York Giants), Johnson (Kansas City Chiefs), Butler (Baltimore Ravens), DJ Roberts (Baltimore Ravens), Abou Toure (Indianapolis Colts), Charles Sweeton (Kansas City Chiefs), Bell (Tennessee Titans), Corey Jordan (Jacksonville Jaguars), Caylon Weathers (Chicago Bears), Brett Thompson (Pittsburgh Steelers), Joe Este (Tennessee Titans), Jaylon Moore (Baltimore Ravens), Donnell Williams (Tennessee Titans and Washington Commanders), Rodney Williams II (Denver Broncos), Dowell (Tennessee Titans), Winn (Los Angeles Rams), Christian Dowell (Denver Broncos), Tevin Shipp (Indianapolis Colts and Seattle Seahawks), DeVonte Tanksley (Miami Dolphins) and Kinkead Dent (Jacksonville Jaguars) have all received opportunities with NFL teams.

Simpson also coached Chapman for two seasons, who became just the 14th Division-I player to rush for 1,000 yards in four consecutive seasons. He was named the program's first-ever OVC Offensive Player of the Year in 2006.

The Skyhawks have won or shared the Sgt. Alvin C. York Trophy - which was established in 2007 and is given annually to the best of the OVC teams located in Tennessee – 11 times. The Skyhawks won the trophy in 2010 and shared it in 2012, 2018, 2019 and 2020 while claiming the trophy outright in 2014, 2015, 2016, 2021, 2022 and 2023. UT Martin owns the best record in the Sgt. York Trophy series while boasting a 37-14 all-time mark.

Prior to accepting his first head coaching job at UT Martin, Simpson was the offensive coordinator at the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga. He was instrumental in the resurgence of the UTC football program. In 2005, Chattanooga posted a 6-5 campaign, the school's first winning season since 1997.

Before Chattanooga, Simpson coached at Texas State University, a member of the Southland Football League. He coached quarterbacks, receivers and served as the team's recruiting coordinator. In 2000, Texas State posted a 7-4 record, the school's first winning season in 10 years.

Simpson served as an assistant coach from 1997-1999 at Jacksonville State University. He coached quarterbacks and was the team's passing game coordinator. He also coached receivers and served as an assistant special teams coordinator. He was a member of the Jacksonville State staff responsible for the third best turnaround in Division I football for the 1997 and 1998 seasons.

An Ellisville, Miss. native, Simpson signed as a quarterback with Mississippi State and played for two seasons for the Bulldogs. He also played baseball for Ron Polk at Mississippi State before transferring to Southern Miss in 1992. At Southern Miss, Simpson was a two-time all-conference selection in baseball and was team captain his senior season.

After earning a bachelor's degree in 1994 from Southern Miss, he spent the next year as a graduate assistant football coach at Delta State, where he coached defensive backs. In the spring of 1995, Simpson served as an assistant football and head baseball coach at Collins High School in Mississippi.

Simpson and his wife, the former Julie Wilkerson, have two sons and a daughter: Ty, Emma and Graham. The family lives in Martin and attends First Baptist Church.
