SETTING THE SCENE



PLAYER TO WATCH

Running back **Tommy Ansley** will look to build upon a strong debut season in 2025 after leading the team with 565 rushing yards while adding two touchdowns on 121 carries. He also tallied 18 receptions for 142 yards and a touchdown.

Ansley is one of 12 Skyhawks named to the OVC Preseason Players to Watch team.

» A new season of Skyhawk football kicks off under the lights at Hardy M. Graham Stadium as the University of Tennessee at Martin opens its 2026 campaign against United Athletic Conference foe Central Arkansas on Thursday, Aug. 27. Kickoff is scheduled for 6:30 p.m. on ESPN+.

» The season opener begins the 21st campaign of the Jason Simpson era and pits a pair of established FCS programs against one another for the first time in more than a decade. UT Martin and Central Arkansas have not met since 2014, adding another layer of intrigue to an already important nonconference matchup with the Bears holding a 9-5 advantage in the all-time series.

» Thursday's matchup begins a challenging nonconference slate for the Skyhawks. UT Martin will play its first two contests at Hardy M. Graham Stadium before hitting the road for three consecutive games, including matchups against FBS opponents West Virginia and Memphis along with longtime rival Austin Peay. This marks the first time the Skyhawks have hosted their season opener since the 2022 campaign while boasting a 17-3 record in home openers during Simpson's tenure.

» UT Martin enters the season with lofty expectations after being selected as the preseason favorite in the Ohio Valley Conference and ranked nationally in both FCS Top 25 polls - including a No. 22 ranking in the AFCA Coaches' Poll and No. 23 ranking in the Stats Perform Top 25. The Skyhawks received six of eight first-place votes and 47 points in the league's preseason poll after winning or sharing four conference championships over the previous five seasons in 2021, 2022, 2023 and 2024. UT Martin also recorded FCS playoff victories in both 2021 and 2024 during that stretch.

» While the Skyhawks will feature several new faces in prominent roles with 53 newcomers on the roster, the cupboard is not bare for Simpson and company as UT Martin had 12 players selected to the OVC Preseason Players to Watch teams. Joining that list was **Tommy Ansley** (running back), **Phaizon Wilson** (wide receiver), **Kaleb Costner** (tight end), **Travis Gray** (offensive line), **Chris Franklin** (all-purpose), **Brandon Sims** (place kicker), **Broderick Tommie, Jr.** (defensive line), **Trey Cotton** (defensive back), **Jamarcus Smith** (linebacker), **Max Zuluaga** (punter), **Deuce Oliver** (punt return specialist) and **Hayden King** (long snapper).

» Central Arkansas enters its ninth season under head coach Nathan Brown and brings back 11 returning starters. The bulk of that returning firepower comes on the defensive side of the ball where the trio of defensive lineman Trevion Traylor, linebacker Ashtyn Williams and defensive back Marcus Washington each earned preseason All-UAC honors.

HOME SWEET HOME

» UT Martin has found success at Hardy Graham Stadium with three unbeaten campaigns in the last four years. Additionally, the Skyhawks have won 27 of their last 32 contests at home since 2019 - including a 21-3 record over the past four seasons. Against OVC opponents, the Skyhawks have lost just one game since Apr. 3, 2020 - a record of 16-1.

12 SKYHAWKS NAMED OVC PRESEASON PLAYERS TO WATCH LIST

» 12 Skyhawk were named to the OVC Preseason Players to Watch List. The Skyhawk group includes five players on offense, three on defense and four specialist. Included is running back Tommy Ansley, wide receiver Phaizon Wilson, tight end Kaleb Costner, offensive lineman Travis Gray, all-purpose performer Chris Franklin, defensive lineman Broderick Tommie, Jr., linebacker Jamarcus Smith, defensive back Trey Cotton, place kicker Brandon Sims, punter Max Zuluaga, punt returner Deuce Oliver and long snapper Hayden King.

SKYHAWK OPEN PRESEASON RANKED

» For just the third time in program history, UT Martin opens the 2026 campaign ranked nationally in both polls, ranking No. 22 in the AFCA Coaches' Poll and No. 23 in the Stats Perform FCS Top 25. The Skyhawks were also ranked before the 2007 and 2022 seasons.



SIMPSON RANKS THIRD ALL-TIME IN OVC

» UT Martin head coach Jason Simpson currently sits third in OVC history with 130 career victories. With his win against Gardner-Webb on Oct. 5, 2024 he surpassed former Middle Tennessee coach Charles Murphy. Now in his 20th season at UTM, Simpson ranks as the longest tenured coach in the league while sitting first among active OVC coaches in victories.

» In OVC play alone, Simpson has a career mark of 99-52 through 20 seasons, more than quadrupling the program's 20-win total which stretched through 14 seasons before his tenure. His 99 conference wins rank third in OVC history.

OVC SUPREMACY

» Since the 2006 season, UT Martin ranks as the winningest active member in the Ohio Valley Conference with 99 victories. After winning just 20 games in the team's first 14 years in the league, the Skyhawks are 99-52 since 2006 while sitting 23 wins above the closest program in Eastern Illinois (76-74) during that span. The Skyhawks have finished .500 or above in conference play in 18 of the last 20 seasons - including 10 top-two finishes.

TENNESSEE TOUGH, #MARTINMADE

» Under the direction of head coach Jason Simpson, the Skyhawks have taken pride in winning games against in-state opponents. Since 2014, the Skyhawks have posted a 27-10 record against in-state foes while possessing the second-best overall winning percentage of all Division I programs in the state (FBS and FCS) since 2010 at 57.2 percent.

UT MARTIN PICKED TO WIN OVC

» After winning four of the last five conference championships, the Skyhawks are tabbed to return to a championship level in 2026 after being picked to first in the OVC's annual preseason poll. The Skyhawks received 47 total points and six of eight first place votes.

KING NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

» Veteran long snapper Hayden King was named a preseason first team All-American by both Phil Steele and Stats Perform after earning all-conference first team honors last season. He started all 12 games as the team's primary long snapper and short snapper for a squad which led the country with zero allowed blocked kicks or punts. His specialists converted 95.4 percent of their kick attempts, including 15-of-17 field goal attempts and 27-of-27 PATs. Meanwhile, his punting unit averaged 41.1 yards per punt while adding two tackles on coverage.

BATTLE FOR THE VOLUNTEER STATE

» Football has been a storied part of the state of Tennessee's history for decades. Dating back to the 2010 season, UT Martin ranks second in the state (including all Division I universities) in winning percentage at 56.9 percent. The Skyhawks are 27-10 against in-state foes since 2014.

PHIL STEELE HONORS EIGHT SKYHAWKS ON PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE LIST

» A total of eight UT Martin football players garnered spots on the annual Phil Steele Preseason All-OVC teams. The preseason all-conference teams consisted of three groupings with UT Martin claiming one first team honor, three second team selections and four third team pick.

» Earning a spot on the first team was long snapper Hayden King while wide receiver Phaizon Wilson, punter Max Zuluaga and offensive tackle Travis Gray earned spots on the second team. Making the third team was linebacker Jamarcus Smith, safety Trey Cotton, punt return specialist Deuce Oliver and all-purpose performer Chris Franklin.

CHAMPIONSHIP PEDIGREE

» Regardless of conference affiliation, UT Martin has won or shared four of the last five conference championships. The Skyhawks won back-to-back OVC championships in 2021 and 2022 before picking up back-to-back league trophies in the OVC-Big South Football Association.
 » UT Martin is the just the fifth program to win four or more consecutive titles in the OVC's history and only trails a five-year run by Jacksonville State from 2014-18.

SKYHAWKS OVER THE LAST FIVE YEARS

» UT Martin has seen unparralled success for the program over the last five season. During that stretch, the Skyhawks have racked four conference championship titles and posted a 27-6 record against conference members.

SKYHAWK TANDEM ECLIPSES 100 YARDS

» The Skyhawks had two players each eclipse 100 rushing yards in the same game for the first time since 2023 last year. Running backs Tommy Ansley (118 yards) and Chris Franklin (111 yards) each set new career highs with their first 100-yard rushing performances in a Skyhawk uniform against Tennessee State. The tandem joins a list of performers from 10 other FCS programs to have two players record 100 rushing yards in the same game.

SEASON 97

» The 2026 campaign is UT Martin's 97th season of football despite suspending play during Great Depression (1933) and World War II (1942-45). The Skyhawks are in their 34th season at the NCAA Division I FCS level. UT Martin joined the NCAA Division I ranks in 1992 and have compiled an overall record of 172-223 with three Ohio Valley Conference titles (2006, 2021 and 2022), two OVC-Big South titles (2023 and 2024) and three NCAA Playoff appearance (2006, 2021 and 2024) as a Division-I program.

PLAYOFF HISTORY

» UT Martin has played in the postseason six times in program history with appearances in the 1967 Tangerine Bowl, 1988 Division II playoffs and three berths in the NCAA Division I Championship in 2006, 2021 and 2024. The Skyhawks are 3-3 all-time in the postseason.

Jason Simpson enters his 21st season at the helm of the UT Martin football program in 2026 after transforming the Skyhawks into one of the most consistent and accomplished programs in the Football Championship Subdivision.

Since taking over the program in 2006, Simpson has compiled a 130-98 overall record while posting a remarkable 99-52 mark in conference play. His 130 career victories rank third in Ohio Valley Conference history, while his 99 league wins also stand third all-time behind legendary coaches Roy Kidd and Boots Donnelly.

Under Simpson's leadership, UT Martin has captured five conference championships, earned three FCS playoff berths, produced 45 All-Americans and developed nearly 200 all-conference performers. The Skyhawks have also defeated a pair of Football Bowl Subdivision opponents, knocking off Memphis in 2012 and Kennesaw State in 2024.

Simpson's tenure has produced the most successful sustained stretch in UT Martin's Division I history.

The Skyhawks have claimed conference championships in 2006, 2021, 2022, 2023 and 2024, including an unprecedented run of four consecutive titles from 2021-24. UT Martin became just the fifth program in OVC history to win at least four straight conference championships.

Six of the program's 10 eight-win seasons have come during Simpson's tenure, including each of UT Martin's six such campaigns at the FCS level.

His teams have also reached the FCS playoffs three times. UT Martin earned its first Division I postseason berth under Simpson in 2006 before returning to the playoffs in 2021 and 2024. The Skyhawks recorded the first two FCS playoff victories in school history during the latter two appearances.

The historic run has earned Simpson recognition among the nation's top coaches. He is a four-time finalist for the Eddie Robinson FCS Coach of the Year Award and a two-time OVC Roy Kidd Coach of the Year, earning the league's top coaching honor in 2006 and 2021. Simpson was also selected as the AFCA Region 3 Coach of the Year following his debut season in 2006.

The success of the Simpson era has represented a dramatic shift in UT Martin's standing within its conference.

The Skyhawks have won 99 conference games during his tenure after the program recorded just 20 OVC victories over its first 14 seasons as a league member. Likewise, Simpson has coached 187 all-conference selections after UT Martin totaled only 33 during its first 15 seasons in the OVC.

His program has produced 44 All-Americans, along with 81 first-team all-conference selections, 84 second-team honorees and 20 all-newcomer selections.

Among the major individual award winners developed during Simpson's tenure are OVC Offensive Players of the Year Don Chapman and Keon Howard, along with defensive standouts John H. Ford II and Keyshawn Johnson, who earned conference Defensive Player of the Year honors.

Aidan Laros was named the inaugural Big South-OVC Football Association Special Teams Player of the Year in 2023, while Chapman, John Bachus III and Sam Franklin each earned OVC Freshman of the Year accolades during their Skyhawk careers.

Two Skyhawks have been selected in the NFL Draft during his tenure. Defensive tackle Montori Hughes was selected by the Indianapolis Colts in the fifth round, while wide receiver Colton Dowell was chosen by the Tennessee Titans in the seventh round of the 2023 NFL Draft. Numerous other Skyhawks have earned opportunities with NFL organizations, including Rodney Williams II, Dresser Winn, Jeremy Butler, Joe Gibbs, Quentin Sims, Jaylon Moore and others. The program enjoyed a particularly noteworthy moment in 2023 when Dowell, Williams and Winn simultaneously held spots on NFL active rosters.

UT Martin has also enjoyed tremendous success against its in-state conference rivals during Simpson's tenure. The Skyhawks have won or shared the Sgt. Alvin C. York Trophy 11 times since the award was established in 2007. UT Martin captured the trophy in 2010 and shared the honor in 2012, 2018, 2019 and 2020 before winning outright in 2014, 2015, 2016, 2021, 2022 and 2023. UT Martin has established the best record in Sgt. York Trophy competition with a 37-14 all-time mark.

Prior to earning his first collegiate head coaching opportunity at UT Martin, Simpson built an extensive résumé as an assistant coach throughout the Southeast. He came to Martin after serving as offensive coordinator at Chattanooga, where he helped engineer the resurgence of the Mocs' program. Chattanooga finished 6-5 in 2005, recording its first winning season since 1997.

Before his stint at Chattanooga, Simpson coached quarterbacks and wide receivers while serving as recruiting coordinator at Texas State. He helped the Bobcats to a 7-4 record in 2000, their first winning season in a decade. Simpson also spent three seasons at Jacksonville State from 1997-99, working with quarterbacks and receivers while serving as passing game coordinator and assistant special teams coordinator. He was part of a staff that engineered one of the largest turnarounds in Division I football during the 1997 and 1998 seasons.

His collegiate coaching career began at Delta State, where he worked as a graduate assistant with the defensive backs after earning his bachelor's degree from Southern Miss in 1994. He also spent time as an assistant football coach and head baseball coach at Collins High School in Mississippi.

A native of Ellisville, Mississippi, Simpson originally signed with Mississippi State as a quarterback and spent two seasons with the Bulldogs football program. A talented two-sport athlete, he also played baseball for legendary Mississippi State head coach Ron Polk before transferring to Southern Miss in 1992. Simpson became a two-time all-conference baseball selection for the Golden Eagles and served as team captain during his senior season before earning his bachelor's degree in 1994.

Simpson and his wife, Julie, have three children – Ty, Emma and Graham. Their oldest son, Ty, played quarterback at Alabama, serving as a team captain and guiding the Crimson Tide to the College Football Playoff quarterfinals before being selected 13th overall by the Los Angeles Rams in the first round of the 2026 NFL Draft.

CONWAY, Ark. - The University of Tennessee at Martin football team trailed for only 4:29 of clock time this evening at Southland Conference power Central Arkansas but the Bears scored 12 unanswered points to close out the game in a 26-24 Skyhawk loss at Estes Stadium.

UT Martin (0-2) took the lead with 8:55 remaining in the second quarter and carried a 21-7 lead into the locker room at the half. However, the Bears outscored the Skyhawks by a 19-3 margin in the last 30 minutes of play.

Redshirt sophomore wide receiver Kyle Kerrick had a breakout day offensively, hauling in career-highs of 150 yards receiving on nine catches, including the Skyhawks' go-ahead touchdown in the second quarter. Corey Jordan also was on the receiving end of a UT Martin score and came up just shy of the century mark for receiving yards (99 yards on five catches).

Jarod Neal earned the start at quarterback, throwing for 276 yards on 20-of-28 passing. The redshirt junior added a team-high 34 yards of rushing, accounted for three touchdowns overall (two passing, one rushing).

Defensively, Taino Fears-Perez piled up a career-best 14 tackles (eight solo) while Deilouse Jackson also registered a career-high 11 tackles.

Taylor Reed passed for 157 yards and a touchdown while rushing for a game-high 66 yards on the ground for Central Arkansas, who improves to 1-1 after a narrow seven-point loss at Football Bowl Subdivision member Texas Tech last weekend. Ryan Howard also saw time at quarterback, passing for 94 yards - including the go-ahead 14-yard touchdown pass with 1:11 remaining in the contest.
