SETTING THE SCENE

» The University of Tennessee at Martin football team will renew an old Ohio Valley Conference rivalry when the Skyhawks travel to Austin Peay on Saturday, Sept. 26. Kickoff from Fortera Stadium is scheduled for 1 p.m.

» UT Martin (1-3) continues a challenging four-game road swing after facing back-to-back Football Bowl Subdivision opponents West Virginia and Memphis. The Skyhawks will look to carry the offensive momentum generated during the second half of last week's 45-21 setback at Memphis into their final nonconference contest of the season.

» Freshman quarterback Tate Surber made his first collegiate start against the Tigers and completed 17-of-29 passes for 177 yards, two touchdowns and no interceptions. Surber connected with Makhia Sherrard for an eight-yard touchdown in the second quarter before finding Kaleb Washington for another score in the fourth. The Skyhawks finished the game by scoring touchdowns on all three of their red-zone possessions while converting seven of 13 third-down opportunities.

» Running back Tommy Ansley added his team-leading sixth rushing touchdown of the season against Memphis. The sophomore has accumulated 234 yards on 44 carries through four games while providing a consistent presence in the Skyhawk backfield. Sherrard leads the receiving corps with 13 receptions for 174 yards and a touchdown, while Deuce Oliver is coming off a season-best 69-yard performance.

» Defensively, UT Martin will look to build upon several impact plays from its latest outing. Safety Joel Castleberry recorded his second career interception and returned it 33 yards to help set up a fourth-quarter touchdown. Castleberry and Trey Cotton shared the team lead with eight tackles, while Rasheen Duncan registered an 11-yard sack. Cotton enters the weekend as the Skyhawks' leading tackler with 33 stops.

» Austin Peay (3-1) returns home riding a two-game winning streak and ranked No. 11 in the AFCA Coaches' Poll. The Governors boast a high-powered offense behind the play of quarterback Corey Parson and company, averaging 36.2 points per game while the defense has been stingy, holding FCS opponents to just 13.3 points per game in wins over Gardner-Webb, Morehead State and West Florida.

» Parson headlines the Governors' offense after passing for 833 yards and six touchdowns against only one interception. Dontavious Harper has emerged as his top big-play target, turning eight receptions into 258 yards and four touchdowns. On the ground, Cameron Simmons leads Austin Peay with 177 yards and three scores. Defensively, the team is led with 23 tackles by Trevor Hardy while Malik Denkins has been aggressive in the backfield, tallying 6.5 tackles for loss on the season.

» Saturday marks the first meeting between the in-state programs since 2021. UT Martin owns a 41-27-2 advantage in the all-time series and has won eight of the last 10 matchups. In the team's most recent matchup back in 2021, UT Martin erased a 16-point halftime deficit and scored the game's final 17 points before blocking a potential game-winning field goal as time expired.

Redshirt-freshman Tate Surber made his first collegiate start in the team's matchup at Memphis in Week 3. He finished the game by completing 17-of-29 pass attempts for 177 yards and two passing touchdowns.

After combining for nearly 4,400 yards of offense and 64 touchdowns as a prep senior, Surber has the keys to the Skyhawk offense.

QUICK HITS

BATTLE OF OLD OVC RIVALS

» Saturday's contest renews an old rivalry between UT Martin and Austin Peay with the two programs squaring off 70 times, beginning with the first meeting back in 1930. As Ohio Valley Conference rivals from 1992-2022, UT Martin holds a 41-27-2 advantage in the all-time series. The Skyhawks have held the upper hand in the series in recent history, winning 16 of the last 19 meetings.

SURBER UNDER CENTER

» In his first start for the Skyhawks, redshirt-freshman **Tate Surber** completed 17-of-27 passes for 177 yards and two touchdowns. The two touchdowns marked the first two passing touchdowns for the Skyhawks this season, finding **Makhia Sherrard** for an eight-yard touchdown pass and **Kaleb Washington** for a seven-yard strike.

PROTECTING THE QUARTERBACK

» With a young quarterback under center, the Skyhawks have relied on a strong offensive line to keep the quarterback upright. To date, UT Martin ranks 10th nationally in sacks allowed, allowing 0.75 sacks per game. The success has been behind a consistent starting group of **Santiago Macias** (LT), **Eric Lane** (LG), **Garrett Smith** (C), **Dolapo Egunjobi** (RG) and **Travis Gray** (RT) starting all four games.

ZULUAGA PUNTS IT DEEP

» A booming punt in the first quarter against Memphis put UT Martin specialist **Max Zuluaga** into the program's record books. With the Skyhawks on their own 24, Zuluaga booted a 74-yard punt into the Memphis endzone - ranking as the third-longest punt in program history. His punt only ranked behind an 80-yard blast by **Jade Stillings** in 1997 and a 75-yard punt by **Tyler Larco** in 2022.

TAIL OF FOUR QUARTERS

» This season the Skyhawks have done most of their damage in the even quarters of the second and fourth. UT Martin has outscored opponents 38-34 in the second quarter this season while besting that mark with a 49-31 advantage in the fourth quarter. Unfortunately, the team has struggled out of the gates of both halves, being outscored 75-7 in the first and third quarters.

SKYHAWKS OVER THE LAST FIVE YEARS

» UT Martin has seen unparalleled success for the program over the last five season. During that stretch, the Skyhawks have racked four conference championship titles and posted a 27-6 record against conference members.

TOUGH ROAD STRETCH

» After starting the season with back-to-back home games for the first time since 2002, UT Martin will then have to hit the road for a grueling four-game stretch. The Skyhawks traveled to Big 12 foe West Virginia (Sept. 5) for a first-time meeting before traveling down I-40 for an in-state matchup against Memphis (Sept. 12). From there the squad will make familiar treks to old OVC foe Austin Peay (Sept. 26) before opening league action against Tennessee State (Oct. 10).

» The four-game road trip will mark the longest for the program since 2021 when finishing the regular season with two games on the road and a pair of road matchups in the playoffs. When counting regular season only contests, the Skyhawks have not played four consecutive games on the road since 1993 when they finished the year with games at Eastern Kentucky, Samford, Morehead State and Austin Peay.

TENNESSEE TOUGH, #MARTINMADE

» Under the direction of head coach **Jason Simpson**, the Skyhawks have taken pride in winning games against in-state opponents. Since 2014, the Skyhawks have posted a 27-11 record against in-state foes - including a 26-8 record against in-state FCS opponents.

TURNING DEFENSE INTO OFFENSE

» UT Martin currently leads the FCS in defensive touchdowns this season with two. **Trey Cotton** returned an interception 55 yards for a touchdown against Central Arkansas while **John Betts III** returned a fumble six yards for a touchdown against West Virginia.

BATTLE FOR THE VOLUNTEER STATE

» Football has been a storied part of the state of Tennessee's history for decades. Dating back to the 2010 season, UT Martin ranks third in the state (including all Division I universities) in winning percentage at 56.2 percent. The Skyhawks are 27-11 against in-state foes since 2014.

SIMPSON RANKS THIRD ALL-TIME IN OVC

» UT Martin head coach **Jason Simpson** currently sits third in OVC history with 131 career victories. With his win against Gardner-Webb on Oct. 5, 2024 he surpassed former Middle Tennessee coach **Charles Murphy**. Now in his 21st season at UTM, Simpson ranks as the longest tenured coach in the league while sitting first among active OVC coaches in victories.

BLOCK THAT KICK

» After leading the FCS with eight blocked kicks in 2025, the Skyhawks picked up right where they left off in the season opener against Central Arkansas. On two point after attempts, defensive lineman Chris Wilson blocked a kick - tying the program single game record with Toby Camp (2025) and Dean Wathen (2010) for most blocked kicks in a single game. UT Martin currently leads the FCS once again in 2026 with its two blocked kicks.

TOMMY THE TANK ENGINE

» Junior running back Tommy Ansley is off to a fast start in 2026, already tallying a 100-yard rushing performance and a pair of multi-touchdown rushing outings. After tallying just two touchdowns in 2025, the running back has already blown past that mark through the first four games, recording six touchdowns on the season to rank fifth in FCS and lead the OVC. Additionally, he ranks fifth in total touchdowns (six), eighth in total points scored (36) and 18th in scoring (9.0 ppg).

RUSHING TOUCHDOWN TRIFECTA

» Skyhawk running back Tommy Ansley found the endzone three times in the team's win over Chicago State. Ansley joins a list of 14 individuals in UT Martin's record book to tally three or more rushing touchdowns on 23 occasions.

BETTS WITH THE SCOOP AND SCORE

» Skyhawk outside linebacker John Betts III played a botched handoff perfectly against West Virginia, scooping up a fumble and returning it six yards for a touchdown to score the team's lone points of the contest and avoid a shutout. The fumble return marked the first returned for a touchdown since Daylan Dotson recovered a fumble in the endzone against Houston Christian in 2022.

ZULUAGA PEPPERS THE MOUNTAINEERS

» Punter Max Zuluaga had a big day in the team's matchup against West Virginia by booting four punts for an average of 53.2 yards per punt. That average ranks as the third-highest single-game punt average in program history, sitting behind former All-American Aidan Laros (56.8 at Gardner-Webb, 2023) and All-OVC selection Tyler Larco (55.7 at Kennesaw State, 2022). His best attempt came on a booming 68-yard punt which ranked just outside the program's top-10.

DUO NAMED OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

» After an impressive showing against Chicago State, the UT Martin duo of running back **Tommy Ansley** (Offensive) and linebacker **Reginald Allen Jr.** (Defensive) garnered respective OVC Player of the Week honors.

» Ansley posted the best game of his Skyhawk career by tallying 16 carries while setting new career highs in rushing yards (118) and touchdowns (three). He became the 14th player in program history to rush for three or more touchdowns in a contest and the first since 2024.

» Allen has made a big impact by leading the Skyhawks with eight total tackles in the team's win over Chicago State, recording three solo stops. He also notched 1.5 tackles for loss.

LIONS, TIGERS AND BEARS (OH MY)

» The Skyhawks are taking a page out of the Wizard of Oz playbook this season with matchups against Lions (Lindenwood), Tigers (Memphis and Tennessee State) and Bears (Central Arkansas).

PICK SIX IS 100% COTTON

» Sophomore safety **Trey Cotton** made the most of his first career start in the season opener against Central Arkansas by catching a tipped pass by Jamal Mayers and returning an interception 55 yards for a touchdown in the first quarter. The interception marked the first of Cotton's career and first pick six for a Skyhawk since the 2024 season when the team returned four for touchdowns.

BACK IN THE OVC

» The 2026 season marks a return to the OVC identity for the football brand. The return to the OVC identity follows three successful years of partnership with the Big South Conference under the names Big South-OVC Football Association (2023, 2024) and OVC-Big South Football Association (2025).

» Schools who will play OVC football in 2026 are Charleston Southern, Eastern Illinois, Gardner-Webb, Lindenwood, Southeast Missouri, Tennessee State, UT Martin and Western Illinois.

UT MARTIN PICKED TO WIN OVC

» After winning four of the last five conference championships, the Skyhawks are tabbed to return to a championship level in 2026 after being picked to first in the OVC's annual preseason poll. The Skyhawks received 47 total points and six of eight first place votes.

KING NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

» Veteran long snapper **Hayden King** was named a preseason first team All-American by both Phil Steele and Stats Perform after earning all-conference first team honors last season. He started all 12 games as the team's primary long snapper and short snapper for a squad which led the country with zero allowed blocked kicks or punts. His specialists converted 95.4 percent of their kick attempts, including 15-of-17 field goal attempts and 27-of-27 PATs. Meanwhile, his punting unit averaged 41.1 yards per punt while adding two tackles on coverage.

OVC SUPREMACY

» Since the 2006 season, UT Martin ranks as the winningest active member in the Ohio Valley Conference with 99 victories. After winning just 20 games in the team's first 14 years in the league, the Skyhawks are 99-52 since 2006 while sitting 23 wins above the closest program in Eastern Illinois (76-74) during that span. The Skyhawks have finished .500 or above in conference play in 18 of the last 20 seasons - including 10 top-two finishes.

Jason Simpson enters his 21st season at the helm of the UT Martin football program in 2026 after transforming the Skyhawks into one of the most consistent and accomplished programs in the Football Championship Subdivision.

Since taking over the program in 2006, Simpson has compiled a 130-99 overall record while posting a remarkable 99-52 mark in conference play. His 130 career victories rank third in Ohio Valley Conference history, while his 99 league wins also stand third all-time behind legendary coaches Roy Kidd and Boots Donnelly.

Under Simpson's leadership, UT Martin has captured five conference championships, earned three FCS playoff berths, produced 45 All-Americans and developed nearly 200 all-conference performers. The Skyhawks have also defeated a pair of Football Bowl Subdivision opponents, knocking off Memphis in 2012 and Kennesaw State in 2024.

Simpson's tenure has produced the most successful sustained stretch in UT Martin's Division I history.

The Skyhawks have claimed conference championships in 2006, 2021, 2022, 2023 and 2024, including an unprecedented run of four consecutive titles from 2021-24. UT Martin became just the fifth program in OVC history to win at least four straight conference championships.

Six of the program's 10 eight-win seasons have come during Simpson's tenure, including each of UT Martin's six such campaigns at the FCS level.

His teams have also reached the FCS playoffs three times. UT Martin earned its first Division I postseason berth under Simpson in 2006 before returning to the playoffs in 2021 and 2024. The Skyhawks recorded the first two FCS playoff victories in school history during the latter two appearances.

The historic run has earned Simpson recognition among the nation's top coaches. He is a four-time finalist for the Eddie Robinson FCS Coach of the Year Award and a two-time OVC Roy Kidd Coach of the Year, earning the league's top coaching honor in 2006 and 2021. Simpson was also selected as the AFCA Region 3 Coach of the Year following his debut season in 2006.

The success of the Simpson era has represented a dramatic shift in UT Martin's standing within its conference.

The Skyhawks have won 99 conference games during his tenure after the program recorded just 20 OVC victories over its first 14 seasons as a league member. Likewise, Simpson has coached 187 all-conference selections after UT Martin totaled only 33 during its first 15 seasons in the OVC.

His program has produced 44 All-Americans, along with 81 first-team all-conference selections, 84 second-team honorees and 20 all-newcomer selections.

Among the major individual award winners developed during Simpson's tenure are OVC Offensive Players of the Year Don Chapman and Keon Howard, along with defensive standouts John H. Ford II and Keyshawn Johnson, who earned conference Defensive Player of the Year honors.

Aidan Laros was named the inaugural Big South-OVC Football Association Special Teams Player of the Year in 2023, while Chapman, John Bachus III and Sam Franklin each earned OVC Freshman of the Year accolades during their Skyhawk careers.

Two Skyhawks have been selected in the NFL Draft during his tenure. Defensive tackle Montori Hughes was selected by the Indianapolis Colts in the fifth round, while wide receiver Colton Dowell was chosen by the Tennessee Titans in the seventh round of the 2023 NFL Draft. Numerous other Skyhawks have earned opportunities with NFL organizations, including Rodney Williams II, Dresser Winn, Jeremy Butler, Joe Gibbs, Quentin Sims, Jaylon Moore and others. The program enjoyed a particularly noteworthy moment in 2023 when Dowell, Williams and Winn simultaneously held spots on NFL active rosters.

UT Martin has also enjoyed tremendous success against its in-state conference rivals during Simpson's tenure. The Skyhawks have won or shared the Sgt. Alvin C. York Trophy 11 times since the award was established in 2007. UT Martin captured the trophy in 2010 and shared the honor in 2012, 2018, 2019 and 2020 before winning outright in 2014, 2015, 2016, 2021, 2022 and 2023. UT Martin has established the best record in Sgt. York Trophy competition with a 37-14 all-time mark.

Prior to earning his first collegiate head coaching opportunity at UT Martin, Simpson built an extensive résumé as an assistant coach throughout the Southeast. He came to Martin after serving as offensive coordinator at Chattanooga, where he helped engineer the resurgence of the Mocs' program. Chattanooga finished 6-5 in 2005, recording its first winning season since 1997.

Before his stint at Chattanooga, Simpson coached quarterbacks and wide receivers while serving as recruiting coordinator at Texas State. He helped the Bobcats to a 7-4 record in 2000, their first winning season in a decade. Simpson also spent three seasons at Jacksonville State from 1997-99, working with quarterbacks and receivers while serving as passing game coordinator and assistant special teams coordinator. He was part of a staff that engineered one of the largest turnarounds in Division I football during the 1997 and 1998 seasons.

His collegiate coaching career began at Delta State, where he worked as a graduate assistant with the defensive backs after earning his bachelor's degree from Southern Miss in 1994. He also spent time as an assistant football coach and head baseball coach at Collins High School in Mississippi.

A native of Ellisville, Mississippi, Simpson originally signed with Mississippi State as a quarterback and spent two seasons with the Bulldogs football program. A talented two-sport athlete, he also played baseball for legendary Mississippi State head coach Ron Polk before transferring to Southern Miss in 1992. Simpson became a two-time all-conference baseball selection for the Golden Eagles and served as team captain during his senior season before earning his bachelor's degree in 1994.

Simpson and his wife, Julie, have three children – Ty, Emma and Graham. Their oldest son, Ty, played quarterback at Alabama, serving as a team captain and guiding the Crimson Tide to the College Football Playoff quarterfinals before being selected 13th overall by the Los Angeles Rams in the first round of the 2026 NFL Draft.

Despite facing a 16-point deficit in the first half, the 12th ranked University of Tennessee at Martin football team locked it down in the second half to not only shutout rival Austin Peay but mount a rally to score 17 unanswered points, including the team's eventual game-winning touchdown with 35 seconds to play, to secure a 17-16 victory and remain unbeaten in Ohio Valley Conference play.

After giving up a pair of pick-six interceptions and a field goal in the first half, UT Martin went into halftime facing a 16-0 deficit with just 62 yards of total offense to its credit. With adjustments in hand, the Skyhawks not only held the Governors scoreless in the second half but outgained them 242-104 in the final 30 minutes and strung together three lengthy scoring drives. None of those were more critical than the team's game-winning 20-play, 96-yard drive on the final possession which resulted with a five-yard touchdown pass from Keon Howard to Peyton Logan with 35 seconds to play.

By overcoming the slow start, the Skyhawks (7-1, 3-0 OVC) extended the team's winning streak to seven games - its second-longest streak in program history. The win also gave UT Martin an early advantage in its quest for the annual Sgt. York Trophy, giving the team a 1-0 mark in its first of three contests while improving their overall record to 30-13 all-time in the series.

While it took UT Martin's short-handed offense some time to get in the right gear with the loss of some key components, the team's defense carried a heavy load throughout the contest. In a game billed to be a high-scoring affair between the OVC's top two scoring offenses and yardage leaders, the Skyhawks held the league's top offensive producers to a season-low 199 yards of total offense - nearly 237 yards below their season average. Additionally, with the Gobs two touchdowns coming on the defensive side of the ball off interception returns - the visitors were limited to just three offensive points in the contest. It marked the first time the Skyhawks have held an opponent without an offensive touchdown since the final game of the 2017 against Tennessee Tech.

Highlighting the defensive side of the ball was the team's ability to get stops in the backfield as UT Martin recorded a season-high 11 tackles for loss. Explosive edge rusher Eyabi Anoma played a big part in that total as he recorded a career-high with eight total tackles while notching 4.5 tackles for loss totaling 23 yards - including 1.5 sacks. Another newcomer in graduate transfer Rob Hicks posted his best game in a Skyhawk uniform by tallying 10 tackles while forcing a quarterback hurry in his first start. Meanwhile veteran safety Deven Sims led the pack with 11 stops and 1.0 TFL.

Offensively, Howard completed 15-of-32 passes for 137 yards and one touchdown while throwing two interceptions. He also rushed 10 times for 31 net yards. Logan led the ground attack with 13 carries for 81 yards - averaging 6.2 yards per carry - while tallying three catches for 11 yards and a touchdown. With his big afternoon, Logan moved into sole possession of fourth place on the program's all-time rushing leaderboard with 2,228 career rushing yards - surpassing Henry Williams. Fellow tailback Zak Wallace also had 13 carries for 39 yards and one touchdown.

NO. 22 UT MARTIN FALLS TO CENTRAL ARKANSAS IN 2026 FOOTBALL SEASON OPENER

MARTIN, Tenn. - The No. 22 ranked University of Tennessee at Martin football squad battled tonight in its season opener but fell by a 36-24 margin to Central Arkansas in front of 5,516 fans at Hardy Graham Stadium.

The Skyhawks led late in the second quarter before 16 unanswered points by Central Arkansas tilted the score in favor of the Bears. UT Martin pulled within five points with 9:49 to go in the contest but the Bears answered with the final touchdown of the contest six-plus minutes later.

Sophomore safety Trey Cotton opened the scoring with the Skyhawks' first pick-six since Oct. 26, 2024, taking Central Arkansas' first pass of its second drive 55 yards to the house in the opening quarter. Cotton also forced a fumble while Jamarcus Smith (10 tackles, team-best 1.5 tackles for loss) and Jamal Mayers (nine tackles, three pass breakups) each recorded double-digit stops to pace UT Martin defensively. Chris Wilson additionally blocked a pair of PAT's to tie a school record with Toby Camp (at Lindenwood in 2025) and Dean Wathen (at Murray State in 2010).

Tommy Ansley found the endzone twice out of the Skyhawk backfield, also topping the team with 61 rushing yards on 10 carries. Julian Calvez made his first UT Martin start under center, completing 13 of his 24 passes for 147 yards while adding 37 rushing yards on nine totes. Kaleb Washington tied for the team lead with three catches and tallied a team-best 53 receiving yards in his Skyhawk debut.

Brandon Sims converted a 25-yard field goal in the second quarter, went 3-for-3 in PAT opportunities and placed four of his five kickoff chances for touchbacks. Max Zuluaga also landed his only punt for 48 yards tonight to guide the UT Martin special teams.

"Central Arkansas has a good football team - we don't lose much at home so give them credit," Skyhawk head coach Jason Simpson said. "If you look at the stats, they were 10-of-15 on third downs and we were 3-of-11 and only snapped the ball 57 times. It's a long season and we'll know more about us as we go forward - tonight was some growing pains with 53 new players but we're not going to overreact. We're all in this together - we'll watch the tape, make some adjustments and find an identity for ourselves."

UT MARTIN CRUISES TO 42-7 VICTORY OVER CHICAGO STATE

MARTIN, Tenn. - Six rushing touchdowns paved the way for the University of Tennessee at Martin football squad's first triumph of the 2026 season, a 42-7 victory over Chicago State.

The six scores on the ground were the first time for the Skyhawks since Oct. 8, 2022 at Murray State. Tommy Ansley led the charge with 16 carries for 118 yards with three touchdowns, while Chris Franklin found the endzone twice. Jaydon Peete capped off the scoring with a rushing touchdown as UT Martin ended the contest with 42 unanswered points.

"It felt good to get a win," Skyhawk head coach Jason Simpson said. "We have a really good offensive line - we leaned on those guys and ran behind them tonight. Defensively, we were better tonight with only allowing 4-of-17 on third downs. We're still a work in progress - we'll use this nonconference season to get guys some experience and keep evaluating. We'll look different by the time we get to conference play."

The UT Martin offense piled up 477 yards of total offense (261 passing, 216 rushing) en route to the win. Redshirt freshman Tate Surber went 16-for-23 with 222 passing yards in his collegiate debut, while Julian Calvez added 39 passing yards in his second start of the season. Anthony Carter accumulated a team-high 62 receiving yards while tying three teammates (Connie Hewitt II, Makhia Sherrard and Kaleb Washington) with a team-best three catches.

The Skyhawks allowed only 191 yards of total offense as the swarming defensive unit combined for nine tackles for loss (including two sacks), five quarterback hurries and four pass breakups. Reginald Allen, Jr. corralled a team-high eight tackles with Chris Wilson (1.5 tackles for loss), Duston Chavis (one sack), LaMarion Pierce (two pass breakups) and Bryce Dailey (two quarterback hurries) additionally securing team-highs in their respective statistical categories.

On special teams, Brandon Sims was a perfect 6-for-6 in PAT attempts while also sending three of his seven kickoffs for touchbacks. Max Zuluaga averaged 50.0 yards over three punts.

Playing in its second game since debuting its program last week, Chicago State was led by Adrian Bowers' game-high 10 tackles. Ashton Pannell found De Armond Mathews for a 4-yard passing touchdown for the Cougars' only score midway through the first quarter, but the UT Martin defense conceded just 129 total yards over the final 45 minutes.

UT MARTIN FALLS AT BIG 12 CONFERENCE OPPONENT WEST VIRGINIA

MORGANTOWN, W. Va. - The University of Tennessee at Martin football squad took to the road today for the first time this season, falling by a 52-7 margin at Football Bowl Subdivision opponent West Virginia in front of 47,049 fans at Milan Puskar Stadium.

The Skyhawks (1-2) put together a trio of chunk plays in the opening quarter, averaging 7.3 yards over 20 plays. Julian Calvez hit Connie Hewitt II for a 24-yard pass on the first play of the game before Chris Franklin added a 48-yard run, setting the stage for an eventual UT Martin 1st-and-goal from the 5-yard line. Later in the period, Tate Surber found Kaleb Costner for a 25-yard reception.

At the halftime break, the Skyhawks gained 246 total yards compared to West Virginia's 254 while UT Martin held a 13-8 advantage in first downs. Five of the Skyhawks' seven first-half drives ventured into Mountaineer territory.

In the second half, UT Martin got on the scoreboard with a defensive score. John Betts III scooped up a fumble off a West Virginia read option and returned it across the goal line from six yards out with 3:25 to go in the contest.

Trey Cotton accounted for a game-high 10 tackles today as the Skyhawk defensive unit. Quincy Hamilton and Chris Wilson (0.5 tackles for loss, one pass breakup) also made six tackles apiece to pace UT Martin.

Franklin led the way for the Skyhawk offense today, managing 85 yards on 12 carries for an average of 7.1 yards per tote. Surber took a majority of the snaps at quarterback, going 19-of-28 for 137 yards. His favorite target today was Deuce Oliver, who hauled in a game-high six catches while Costner's 36 receiving yards led nine different UT Martin players who had at least one catch.

On special teams, Max Zuluaga pinned two of his four punts inside the 10-yard line, including a 68-yard boot in the third quarter. Overall, he averaged 53.3 yards per punt while Brandon Sims successfully converted the Skyhawk PAT in the fourth quarter.

The Mountaineers (2-0) was led by quarterback Michael Hawkins, Jr., who combined for four touchdowns while going 5-of-7 for 155 passing yards with 96 rushing yards on six carries. Isaiah Patterson topped the West Virginia defense with eight tackles.

"This was a learning experience for our players in a good environment," UT Martin head coach Jason Simpson said. "When you play a FBS opponent, if you handle it the right way - your team will get better with that experience. I thought our guys competed - we did some good things especially offensively in the first half but it wasn't a very clean game for us and the margin for error is very small."

UT MARTIN DROPS IN-STATE MATCHUP TO MEMPHIS

MEMPHIS, Tenn. - The University of Tennessee at Martin football team scored a pair of fourth-quarter touchdowns but could not overcome an early deficit as Memphis claimed a 45-21 victory on Saturday evening at Simmons Bank Liberty Stadium.

Playing in front of 30,840 fans, UT Martin (1-3) finished with 291 yards of total offense and converted seven of its 13 third-down opportunities. The Skyhawks were particularly effective inside the 20-yard line, scoring touchdowns on all three of their red-zone possessions.

In his first career start, freshman quarterback Tate Surber posted a solid performance by completing 17 of 29 passes for 177 yards and two touchdowns while committing no turnovers. The tandem of Deuce Oliver and Makhia Sherrard paced the team with four receptions. Oliver paced the team with 69 receiving yards on the night - including a 46-yard over the shoulder catch to set up a scoring drive in the fourth quarter. Meanwhile, Sherrard scored the Skyhawks first receiving touchdown of the season by tip-toeing the endzone for a second quarter touchdown snag.

The offensive production continued in the fourth quarter for the Skyhawks as the team punched a pair of touchdowns into the endzone. A dazzling reception by Kaleb Washington resulted in a seven-yard touchdown while running back Tommy Ansley punctuated another scoring drive with a one-yard rush up the middle.

Defensively, Joel Castleberry recorded his second career interception and capped it off with a 33-yard return to set up a scoring drive in the fourth quarter while sharing the team-lead with eight tackles on the night. Sophomore safety Trey Cotton also recorded eight tackles in the contest - including a tackle for loss in the first quarter. Another highlight play came in the second quarter when Rasheen Duncan bull rushed the opposing center and sacked Memphis quarterback Marcus Stokes for an 11-yard loss.

A big play on special teams also flashed on the stat sheet when Max Zuluaga booted a 74-yard punt in the first quarter. The punt marked the third-longest punt in program history, trailing only an 80-yard blast by Jade Stillings in 1997 and a 75-yard punt by Tyler Larco in 2022.

Memphis (3-1) racked up 572 yards of total offense on the night with a balanced attack - including 299 yards on the ground and 273 yards through the air. Stokes provided stability under center, completing 26-of-32 pass attempts for 258 yards and four touchdowns. Meanwhile Jordan Thompson tallied 110 yards and a touchdown on the ground.
