

Exercising Your Attitude

- The most important ingredient

There is no such thing as luck. You make your own luck. It is preparation meeting opportunity.

A positive attitude is the most important ingredient of a champion. By being positive about the circumstances that you are confronted with you can turn negative situations into positive outcomes. You are the person who chooses how you will react in any given situation. If you are headed to a rodeo and blow a tire on your trailer, do you throw a fit and give up or do you figure out how to turn this situation around and do whatever it takes to get to the rodeo. Instead of complaining about the stock they draw, a positive person will accept the challenge of winning in that situation You choose your own.

attitude. A positive attitude is what helps you bounce back from the "bumps and bruises" in rodeo and in life.

A rodeo competitor with a positive attitude, who is committed and dedicated to performing at their peak (even if that person isn't as talented as other rodeo contestants) will always be the winner in the long haul.

"Rodeo is an easy business to excel in. Most of the contestants don't assume responsibility for their own future and rodeo lets them blend in. They are never the winners... they are just the ones that winners make a living off of."
