The most asked question after the Saturday Night Championship Short-Go was, "How can we ever top this year's rodeo for the 50th next year?" It will be a tall order to top the success of the 49th annual UT Martin College Rodeo! Enthusiastic record breaking crowds again, the men's team won their home rodeo while the women's team placed second, and voted Ozark Region's "Rodeo of the Year" for the 12th straight time. What an amazing weekend!

A few highlights of the rodeo were the breakaway trio of Alexandria Hancock, Shara Adcock and Kenzley Wilson being the top 3 ropers in the average. Quick runs by the team ropers with Quentin Sawyer & Patrick Houchins winning the average, Tucker Kail & Colt Mathews placing 3rd and Ross Mitchell & partner ending up 5th. Domination by the barrel racers with over half of the top 10 in the short go being cowgirls from UTM, led by Nealey Dalton winning the average riding a healthy Miss Mango. Ryan McDaniel winning a round in the bull riding.

Coach Luthi was overwhelmed with how the rodeo turned out. "Our 49th Annual Rodeo was amazing! I want to thank all the people that helped to put it on; from our rodeo booster club, our athletic department, the Ag Pavilion staff, sponsors and everyone who volunteered to help. I really didn't think we would top last year's rodeo but we did." He continued, "God is so good. We want to thank everyone that has a part in making the UT Martin College Rodeo so special."

Season Recap

The Skyhawk Rodeo Team completed the season with the men's team finishing 4th in the Ozark Regional Standings and the women's team placing 3rd. It was pretty much a year of highs and lows. Said Coach Luthi, "We had some highlights and some really good things happen for us this year. Overall, however, we just didn't have enough people performing at a high level on a consistent basis. We do have a lot of returnees and with a few quality recruits we will strive to be more consistent in the 2017 – 2018 season."

This year the UT Martin Rodeo Team qualified 7 cowboys and cowgirls to compete at the College National Finals Rodeo in Casper, Wyoming. It begins on June 11th with Bulls, Broncs and Breakaway and continues until June 17th. The CNFR is the "best of the best" in college rodeo. It is where the National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association crowns individual event champions in saddle bronc riding, bare back riding, bull riding, tie-down roping, steer wrestling, team roping, barrel racing, breakaway roping, and goat tying. National team championships are also awarded to both men's and women's teams. Over 400 cowboys and cowgirls from over 100 universities and colleges compete in Casper each year. Contestants compete all year in one of the NIRA's 11 regions for a chance to rope or ride at the CNFR.

The team will be made up of a lot of new faces with only Nealey Dalton and Douglas Rich having competed previously at the CNFR. Also qualifying are Houston Herbert, Ryan McDaniel, Ross Mitchell, Madison Crow and Kenzley Wilson. According to Coach Luthi, "We are very thankful to have a good group going to the College Finals this year. The CNFR is a great rodeo but we'll have to remember it is just like any other rodeo. We will still have to focus on doing the best we can with the stock and positions that we draw. Hopefully people will know we were there when it's all over"

The top three students in each event, and top two men's and women's teams from the NIRA's 11 regions will qualify for the CNFR.








