49th Annual UTM Rodgo

We are gearing up for the 49th Annual UT Martin Rodeo a bit earlier this year with the rodeo beginning April 6 - 8. Last year, UTM was chosen as the Rodeo of the Year by the Ozark Region for the eleventh year in a row (11 out of 11 years!). We have been setting attendance records the past few years during the rodeo and are working hard to continue that trend. Coach Luthi remarked. "It's always a lot of fun to host our home rodeo, especially seeing all the alumni who return each year, but it also takes a tremendous amount of hard work. We couldn't begin to put on a rodeo this size without the help of the Rodeo Booster Club, the UT Martin athletics staff and the many volunteers that help in so many key areas".

Garrett Yerigan is returning as the rodeo announcer. No stranger to the big stage, Garrett set a record in 2014 as the youngest announcer ever at the International Finals Rodeo, has announced the National Junior High Rodeo Finals and many other professional and college rodeos. Brian White will again be back as the unpredictable clown/funny man. He does a great job not only in the arena but in the community as well. He comes to town a few days early and visits local schools where he does a fantastic job sharing his "Importance of Goal Setting Program" with students.

Mark Johnson and Universal Rodeos of Jonesboro, Arkansas will once more be bringing the rank bucking stock for the bareback, saddle bronc and the always exciting bull riding! Coach John Luthi talks about "how exciting it is to look at the draw and see if his bareback riders had drawn 8X or 462, who got KK in the saddle bronc riding or if anyone would ride 245 in the bull riding. Mark and his crew are always easy to work with and really are a plus in us putting on a quality performance."



RODEO POSTER FEATURES COLT KITAIF AND WILL LUMMUS

The 2017 UT Martin Rodeo poster features alumni Colt Kitaif and Will Lummus. Both were members of the 2014 UTM National Championship Men's Team.

Will competed at the timed event end of the arena for Martin. In 2013 he won the Ozark Region in the steer wrestling and qualified for the College National Finals Rodeo. In the 2nd round he was 4.9 in the steer wrestling and split 6th place.

In 2014 he again was first in the regional standings of the steer wrestling as well as the reserve champion in the tie down roping and went to the CNFR with an automatic bid in each event. In the tie down roping he split 8th in the third round with a 9.5 run and finished the year as the 4th best tie down roper in the nation. Will also split 5th in the steer wrestling, made the short go and was in the top 10 nationally. He ended up 6th in the All-Around standings and helped lead UT Martin to their first ever National Championship.

He is now engaged to be married and is rodeoing professionally.

Colt Kitaif is a former rough stock rider for UTM, specializing in the bareback riding. In 2014 he was a member of the UT Martin men's team that qualified for the College Finals after placing 5th in the Ozark Region in the bareback riding. Once at the College Finals he placed 3rd in the first round with a great 78.5 point ride, contributing to the points that helped UT Martin to win the Men's Rodeo Team National Championship.

Colt is currently a professional cowboy and stock contractor with J.C. Kitaif Pro Rodeos.





TANNER PHIPPS FEATURED ON BILLBOARD



Be sure to be on the lookout for this billboard in downtown Milan (new location) featuring UTM cowboy Tanner Phipps. Tanner was a member of the 2014 UT Martin Men's National Championship Team. He finished the year 3rd in the Ozark Region in the bareback riding and place 5th in the 2nd round of the College National Finals Rodeo with a 77 point ride.

In 2015 Tanner qualified for the CNFR by placing 2nd in the regional standings. At the CNFR he ended up 14th in the nation in the bareback riding.

Tanner was again 2nd in the Ozark Region bareback riding standings in 2016 and qualified for the College Finals where he placed 3rd in the second round with a 74 point ride. He made the championship short go and finished the year in the top 10 of the national standings.

Crawfish Supper



"Well, you might have to stay all day. Make yourself at home."


