The UT Martin Rodeo Team headed west to Casper, Wyoming for another trip to the College National Finals Rodeo this past June. It was a more inexperienced group than previous Skyhawk teams, "But did have lots of talent," according to Coach Luthi.

On the women's side, Nealey Dalton and Madison Crow qualified in the barrel racing and Kenzley Wilson in the breakaway roping. Nealey was making her 4th appearance at the CNFR on her great horse "Miss Mango". The duo placed deep in the first two rounds (6th in first go and 2nd in the second go) but hit a barrel in the third round to keep them out of the short go. In her first trip to Casper, Kenzley came out on fire and won the first round of the breakaway roping with a blazing 2.3 run. This helped propelled the women's team to second in the national standings after the first couple rounds. However with tough luck in the third round, no one qualified for the short go on Saturday night. They did finish as the 10th ranked women's team in the nation for 2017.

Douglas Rich and Ross Mitchell both earned spots at the CNFR in the team roping. Houston Herbert and Ryan McDaniel qualified in the bareback riding and bull riding. Douglas was the lone competitor on the men's side with CNFR experience and he did not disappoint. Heeling for Marcus Theriot of East Mississippi, they won the second go round with a 5.4 time. Freshman Ross Mitchell, heading for Ethan Wheeler of EMCC, had a tremendous Finals. In his first trip to Casper he placed in the first round, won the short go with a 5.5 and finished the year 2nd in the nation. As a team the men finished the year 14th in the nation.

"SKYHAWKS ON THE RISE" KICK-OFF DINNER




