SKYHAWK FIELD

THE UNIVERSITY OF TENNESSEE AT MARTIN WOMEN’S SOCCER PROGRAM HAS CALLED SKYHAWK FIELD ITS HOME SINCE 1998. IT IS A 120x75 BERMUDA PITCH WITH A PRESS BOX AND PERMANENT SEATING FOR OVER 500 FANS ALONG THE WEST SIDELINE. FANS ALSO CIRCLE THE FIELD WITH TRUCKS, LAWN CHAIRS AND COUCHES TO CREATE A FESTIVE ATMOSPHERE THAT IS INTIMIDATING TO OPPONENTS.

ON NOV. 4, 2012, UT MARTIN PROVIDED A BIT OF HISTORY AGAINST AUSTIN PEAY IN THE OVC TOURNAMENT CHAMPIONSHIP. IN THAT MATCH, THE RAUCOUS CROWD OF 773 FANS CHEERED ON THE SKYHAWKS TO A THRILLING 2-0 VICTORY - PASSING THE PROGRAM’S ALL-TIME RECORD FOR SINGLE-GAME ATTENDANCE. IN FACT, FIVE OF THE SKYHAWKS NINE HOME GAMES RANKED AMONGST THE TOP CROWDS IN SKYHAWK FIELD HISTORY.

PRIOR TO THE 2012 SEASON, SKYHAWK FIELD SAW THE ADDITION OF FIELD LIGHTS MAKING CONDITIONS APPROPRIATE FOR NIGHT MATCHES. THE FIRST MATCH PLAYED UNDER THE LIGHTS WAS ON AUG. 17, 2012, AGAINST SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE POWER VANDERBILT. ALTHOUGH THE SKYHAWKS DROPPED THE MATCH 2-0, THE NIGHT MARKED THE FIRST OF THREE NIGHT GAMES FOR THE SKYHAWKS IN 2012 IN ADDITION TO HOSTING THE 2012 OHIO VALLEY CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT.

IN THE SUMMER OF 2010, SKYHAWK FIELD RECEIVED A MASSIVE FACELIFT. NEW COLORFUL WIND SCREENS WERE ALSO ADDED TO GIVE THE FIELD A PROFESSIONAL EXTERIOR LOOK, AND NEW BRICK BARRIERS WERE ALSO BUILT AROUND BOTH BENCHES. ANOTHER NEW FEATURE ADDED ARE A PAIR OF LARGE TENTS THAT HAVE BEEN PLACED OVER THE TWO ADJACENT SETS OF BLEACHERS THAT SANDWICH THE MAIN BLEACHERS. THIS PROVIDES A COMFORTABLE, SHADY CLIMATE FOR FANS OF ALL AGES TO ENJOY.

THE FIRST MATCH PLAYED AT SKYHAWK FIELD, WAS ON SEPT. 4, 1998, AGAINST OHIO VALLEY CONFERENCE FOE TENNESSEE TECH. ALTHOUGH THE SKYHAWKS DROPPED A TOUGH 1-0 DECISION IN THAT MATCH, THEY CAME ROARING BACK FOR THE FIRST HOME WIN IN PROGRAM HISTORY ON THEIR NEXT TRY - A 2-1 WIN OVER OVC OPPONENT MOREHEAD STATE ON SEPT. 12, 1998.

OVER THE YEARS, THE SKYHAWKS HAVE PUT TOGETHER A 82-55-7 RECORD WHILE PLAYING IN FRONT OF THE HOME CROWD. HOWEVER, UT MARTIN HAS ENJOYED A TREMENDOUS HOME-FIELD ADVANTAGE OVER THE LAST SEVERAL SEASONS. SINCE 2002, THE SKYHAWKS ARE 79-29-7 IN MATCHES PLAYED AT SKYHAWK FIELD, HAVING LOST ONLY 14 MATCHES ON THEIR HOME TURF IN THE LAST EIGHT SEASONS.



IN 2009, THE SKYHAWKS MATCHED THE BEST HOME START TO ANY SEASON BY BEGINNING THE YEAR 6-0-0, AND ENDED THE SEASON WITH THE HIGHEST SINGLE-SEASON HOME WINNING PERCENTAGE (.857) IN PROGRAM HISTORY. THE 2010 SQUAD FOLLOWED THAT WITH A FIVE-MATCH HOME WINNING STREAK, WHICH INCLUDED SHUTOUTS IN ALL FIVE MATCHES AND CONFERENCE WINS OVER AUSTIN PEAY, JACKSONVILLE STATE AND TENNESSEE TECH.

SKYHAWK FIELD HAS ALSO BEEN HOME TO THE PUMA SKYHAWK INVITATIONAL FROM 2002-2007 AND 2009, AS WELL AS THE FIRST ROUND OF THE OHIO VALLEY CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT IN 1999, 2003, 2008 AND HOSTED THE 2012 TOURNAMENT IN ITS’ ENTIRETY.

COACHING STAFF

HEAD COACH PHIL McNAMARA



The University of Tennessee at Martin soccer program has grown into one of the top programs in Ohio Valley Conference history behind the work of head coach Phil McNamara, who enters his seventh season at the helm after being named UT Martin's fourth head coach on March 23, 2010.

During his tenure at UT Martin, McNamara has continued to build an impressive resume. Having won four consecutive OVC titles, including two regular season and tournament championships, McNamara has guided players to 14 All-OVC first team honors, five earning second team honors and 12 on the All-Newcomer teams. McNamara helped Skyhawks earn their first OVC Player of the Year in 2014 when Rianna Jarrett brought home the award. In his second season, McNamara helped Melissa Govea earn UT Martin's first OVC Defensive Player of the Year award in 2012.

In 2015, McNamara saw the Skyhawks open the season with a school-record four victories on their way to a fourth-straight season with double-digit wins. Guiding the team to a 12-6-2 record including a 6-3-1 conference slate, the Skyhawks were offensively gifted by leading the OVC in shots taken. The season saw newcomer Rianna Jarrett set a school-record with 17 goals on her way to the program's first OVC Player of the Year honor. In the conference tournament, UT Martin fell in a shootout to Jacksonville State.

In 2013 McNamara guided the Skyhawks to their fourth-consecutive as he led the Skyhawks to a piece of conference history. The Skyhawks picked up their fourth consecutive OVC title, including two regular season and tournament championships, after rattling off an 8-2 record in conference play to win their second consecutive season crown. The Skyhawks became the first team in conference history to pull off such a streak.

After McNamara took the Skyhawks to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in program history, he posted arguably the best season in school history in 2012. UT Martin captured its first outright Ohio Valley Conference regular season championship on its way to a new program record for single-season winning percentage (.659, 13-6-3). In the NCAA Tournament, the Skyhawks pushed Southeastern Conference power Kentucky to the limit before a narrow 1-0 loss in overtime.

For his efforts, McNamara garnered 2012 OVC Coach of the Year honors. He also presided over five players who were All-OVC performers, including Saphyra Coombs-James - the program's first-ever OVC Freshman of the Year. All in all, eight of McNamara's players earned All-OVC or All-OVC Tournament accolades in 2012.

McNamara's second season at UT Martin was a banner year, as the Skyhawks captured their first-ever OVC Tournament championship in 2011. UT Martin won a program-record six straight games from Oct. 21 through Nov. 6 on its way to a school record for victories (14) before falling to then-undefeated Memphis in its first NCAA Tournament match in school history. The Skyhawks boasted four players on the All-OVC team, including Melissa Govea (the league's Defensive Player of the Year.)

In his debut season as Skyhawk skipper, McNamara guided UT Martin to an 8-8-2 record and 3-4-1 OVC slate. The Skyhawks began to click midway through the schedule, winning seven of nine games during one stretch. UT Martin also continued its home dominance under McNamara, putting together a five-match win streak and going unbeaten for a 58-day span, falling only in the home opener and finale in 2010. The stingy Skyhawk defense also excelled under McNamara, as the team tied an all-time single-season record with eight shutouts.

McNamara came to UT Martin from Carson-Newman College in Jefferson City, Tenn., where he led the Eagles to the NCAA Division II championship tournament in each of his last seven years. His teams advanced to the NCAA Final Four in back-to-back years in 2004-05 and won five regular season league titles and four South Atlantic Conference tournaments. During his eight-year tenure at Carson-Newman, he picked up the South Atlantic Conference Coach of the Year honor four times.

At Carson-Newman, McNamara's teams were consistently ranked, as his players garnered several top honors throughout his tenure. All in all, he coached 43 all-conference players, 22 all-region players, four All-SAC Tournament members, four All-SAC tournament MVP's, four All-Americans (including the first in Carson Newman history), four All-NCAA Tournament team players, three SAC Players of the Year and two SAC Freshmen of the Year. In addition to coaching the program's first-ever national All-American, he also guided the Eagles to the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance and NCAA Tournament victories. Four players also earned national or regional academic All-American awards under his watch.



McNamara's 2009 Carson-Newman team was the best in school history, as they set a single-season record for most wins (20). They finished ranked seventh in the nation after winning their third NCAA Southeast Regional title under his guidance. McNamara won 11 games or more every year for the past eight years at Carson-Newman.

Before Carson-Newman, McNamara served two seasons at Virginia Intermont in Bristol, Va.. He posted a 17-12 record and he led the team to both conference and regional championships. He was named conference and regional coach of the year.

McNamara has three European coaching licenses and has served as a youth coach for the Irish Football Association (IFA) in Belfast, Northern Ireland. As a player, he was a YTS trainee with Ashton Villa FC in England for two years, and spent one season with the Carrickfergus Rangers FC in the Irish First Division. He was a member of the Cliftonville FC in the Irish Premier League for four years before ending his playing career in the United States.

McNamara is married to the former Jacqueline Logue of Belfast, Northern Ireland, and has two children, Halina and Anthony.

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH LESLIE GILLIES



Leslie Gillies begins her third season as assistant head coach after serving as a full-time assistant coach at the University of Tennessee at Martin since 2010.

Gillies has been instrumental in building an impressive resume throughout her time at UT Martin as she led the Skyhawks to a piece of conference history in 2013. The Skyhawks picked up their fourth consecutive OVC title, including two regular season and tournament championships, after rattling off an 8-2 record in conference play to win their second consecutive season crown. The Skyhawks became the first team in conference history to pull off such a streak.

The Skyhawks saw five players take home six OVC awards, highlighted by three All-OVC first team selections for Mariah Klenke, Aoife Lennon and Hannah Fessenden while Alyssa Curtis earned second team honors. As a whole, six Skyhawks took home either All-OVC or All-OVC Tournament accolades in 2013.

In 2012, Gillies was part of arguably the best season in Skyhawk soccer history. UT Martin cruised through its first-ever Ohio Valley Conference regular season championship on its way to a 13-6-3 overall record. For the second straight season, UT Martin advanced to the NCAA Tournament, where it battled against Southeastern Conference power Kentucky before falling 1-0 in overtime. The Skyhawks' .659 season winning percentage ranks first in school history.

Gillies guided eight Skyhawks to either All-OVC or All-OVC Tournament honors in 2012.

In 2011, Gillies helped guide the Skyhawks to their first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance, as a result of winning the OVC Tournament championship. She presided over a squad that shattered the program record for matches played (23), victories (14), highest winning percentage (.652), longest winning streak (six), points (120), assists (34) and shots (383).

Gillies coached four All-OVC performers in 2011, led by OVC Defensive Player of the Year Melissa Govea.

In 2010, Gillies and the Skyhawks found their groove at the midpoint of the season, as UT Martin produced victories in seven of nine matches during one spurt in the schedule. She also oversaw a defense that grinded out eight shutouts, which tied a single-season UT Martin program record.

Prior to UT Martin, Gillies spent three seasons as an assistant coach to current Skyhawk head coach Phil McNamara at Carson-Newman, helping the Eagles to a 40-14-2 record (including a school-record 20 wins in 2009), three consecutive NCAA Division-II Tournament appearances and two South Atlantic Conference regular-season and tournament titles.

At Carson-Newman, Gillies was responsible for the organization of practices, ongoing recruitment, workouts, administrative duties such as travel and scheduling, player development and team preparation, among other things.



Not only did Gillies coach with McNamara at Carson-Newman, she also finished out her collegiate playing career for him from 2004 through 2006 before graduating with a bachelor's degree in applied psychology in 2007.

In those three seasons, Gillies led the team to a 53-10-3 record, including an 18-3 conference slate. A forward and outside midfielder, she led the team to back-to-back NCAA Division-II Tournament Final Fours, as well as two regular-season SAC titles and two SAC Tournament titles. Perhaps the most impressive feat is that as a player, she was part of the three most winningest seasons in Carson-Newman history at that point in time, including a then-school-record 19 wins in 2004.

Before playing at Carson-Newman, Gillies spent two seasons playing in Conference-USA for head coach Paul Harbin at the University of Alabama at Birmingham. As a true freshman, she logged 203 minutes and scored her first career point on an assist against Jackson State on Oct. 25, 2002. The next season, she saw limited action because of an injury. In her two years at UAB, the Blazers went 22-14-2 with a 13-7 league record.

A Marietta, Ga. native, Gillies was a four-year letterwinner at Sprayberry High School, where she was an all-star selection in the state of Georgia. She scored 56 goals - including a team-high 21 her junior season - in her career and led the Yellow Jackets to a state 5A quarterfinalist berth in 2001, as well as a 6AAAA Sub-Region championship and pair of 6AAAA Sub-Region runner-up appearances.

Leslie married Chris Gillies in November 2012. The couple resides in Martin.

ASSISTANT COACH MARY MANCIN

Head Coach Phil McNamara announced the addition of Mary Mancin to the University of Tennessee at Martin's soccer staff as an assistant coach in August 2016. Mancin will work directly with the Skyhawk goalkeepers.

Mancin joins the Skyhawk staff after a stint as the goalkeeper coach at Belmont University, where she coached Oakland University junior transfer Stephanie Bukovec, who was named to the All-OVC second team, All-OVC Newcomer team, and accrued multiple OVC goalkeeper of the week honors in the fall of 2015. The junior broke into the Belmont record book in her first season with the Bruins in GAA, saves, shutouts, and minutes played.



Prior to Belmont, Mancin served as a graduate assistant coach (2013-2015) at Columbus State University, alongside Peach Belt Conference all-time winningest head coach, Jay Entlich.

On their way to a No. 5 final ranking in 2013, the Lady Cougars rolled undefeated to a Peach Belt Conference regular season championship and capped it off with a perfect run through the conference tournament. The Columbus State run continued into the NCAA Tournament with a pair of wins before ultimately falling in the national quarterfinals. The Lady Cougars went 15-6-1 and won a share of the PBC regular season title for the first time since 2010.

Columbus State reached as high as seventh in the national poll after a midseason run which the Lady Cougars won seven matches in a row and earned a share of the conference crown. CSU earned its eighth straight selection to the NCAA Tournament, becoming the only team in the nation to reach the tournament without a senior on the roster. The Lady Cougars reached the second round of the tournament before falling in a penalty kick shootout.

In the 2014 campaign, Lady Cougars posted a 21-1-1 overall record, tying the then-program record for wins in a season. Columbus State vaulted as high as No. 2 in the country during the season and completed its first undefeated regular season in program history.

In her playing career, Mancin was a four-year member of the Lady Cougars soccer program and posted a 43-8-6 mark for Columbus State. Her 43 victories are the second-most recorded by a Lady Cougar goalkeeper. She also ranks second on the all-time list in saves (176), second in save percentage (.842) and goals against average (0.60), and third in shutouts (16). In 2011, Mancin recorded nine shutouts, the most ever by a CSU player and the eighth-most in Peach Belt Conference single-season history.

Mancin was selected to the Daktronics All-Southeast Region second team, Scholar All-Region first team, NSCAA All-Southeast Region third team, and Peachbelt Conference All-Academic team in 2011. During the summer prior to her senior year, Mancin was the starting goalkeeper and captain for the WPSL Georgia Revolution that finished second in the WPSL league in its inaugural season. She was named to the WPSL first team all-conference team. In 2012, she also was named to the All-Peach Belt Conference first team and NSCAA All-Region first team for her senior season and tallied five PBC goalkeeper of the week honors.

In addition, Mancin currently holds a United States Soccer Federation "C" License. She joined the Tennessee Olympic Development Staff in February 2015, specifically working with the goalkeepers, and also became a USYS Region III ODP Region Coach that same summer.

She graduated from Columbus State with a bachelor's degree in exercise science in 2013 and earned her Master's degree in exercise science in May 2015.

Katherine Malik enters her ninth season as an assistant athletic trainer at The University of Tennessee at Martin. She serves as the primary athletic trainer for the Skyhawk soccer and softball teams, while also assisting with day-to-day operations with all other UT Martin sports teams.

Malik came to the Skyhawk Sports Medicine staff from Birmingham Southern where she was also an assistant athletic trainer, working primarily with the women's soccer, women's basketball, softball and lacrosse teams.

Prior to her time at Birmingham Southern, Malik spent a year as an intern at Georgia Tech and two years as a graduate assistant at the University of Central Florida.

While at Georgia Tech, Malik worked with the football and track programs and at Central Florida she worked primarily with the women's soccer team while earning a master's degree in physical education.

Malik is a 2004 graduate of the University of Florida, earning a degree in exercise science and is married to her husband, Tyson Malik.

SKYHAWKS SET THEIR SIGHTS ON OVC TITLE IN 2016

Be consistent. Stay healthy. That is the simple recipe that University of Tennessee at Martin head soccer coach Phil McNamara has been reiterating to his team during the 2016 fall camp.

Last year the Skyhawks boasted the title of NCAA's youngest team with 15 of the 19 players being freshmen. McNamara said with that many underclassmen playing significant roles, mistakes and injuries were bound to happen.

"We've got to be more consistent than last year and we have to stay healthy," McNamara said. "Our numbers are short and we have a small squad, but a qualified one."

Injuries were a key factor as the Skyhawks struggled out of the gate last year. McNamara says it is something that every team has to deal with.

"It's just a part of women's soccer," McNamara said. "Sometimes you're just going to lose one or two

players for the season." However, having so many freshmen is not always a bad thing. Since everyone is so young, the competition for playing time makes camps and practices that much more competitive and with the coaching staff bringing in another strong class of recruits, McNamara is hoping that intensity carries over to the pitch.

"I think the freshmen we have this year are a little more experienced and qualified," McNamara said. "There's going to be four or five new faces in the starting 11, which is a step forward. We are excited about that."

Building depth was an important part of the offseason. That was the emphasis of the coaching staff and it showed in the new players that were brought in. The Skyhawks added forwards Nicole Collins, Sam Clymer, and Danae Kaldaridou to build on what is one of the strongest groups in the OVC.

The Skyhawk forwards will be led by their lone senior Saphyra Coombs-James. During her career, Coombs-James ranks in the top-10 in UT Martin history in points, goals, assists, and shots. She is also currently tied for the most game-winning goals in Skyhawk history with eight. Coming into the year so highly touted is something that she has come to expect from McNamara, who knows how big a role she plays in his team's success.

"She's key," McNamara said. "She is very capable of handling a lot of pressure and taking two

or three players out of the game, which releases other players for opportunities."

After an injury ended her 2013 season, Coombs-James has been searching for the form that earned her OVC Freshman of the Year honors in 2012. The coaching staff has been impressed with her leadership during camp and they hope is it something other players build off of.

"So far this has been the best preseason (Coombs-James) has had in her time here," McNamara said. "Obviously she had a phenomenal freshman year, but she's arrived fitter this year and more determined with a better attitude."

Coombs-James led the team last year in goals, assists, points and shots. While the UT Martin coaching staff wants her continued success, they also would like to see major contributions from the

new players. McNamara says those players have fit in nicely thus far.

"A few individuals have come in and done really well," McNamara said. "They have actually gone above and beyond expectations on the front end, so that's exciting moving forward."

Controlling the mid-field was one of the strong points for the Skyhawks in 2015. Sophomore Maggie Burkett is back and looking to build off her first team All-OVC honors from a year ago. Burkett plays a key role in set pieces, as she took 62 of 80 corners in 2015. Also returning as midfielders are sophomores Amy McGivern, Sara Ketis and redshirt freshman Sophia Sharos.

Defense and goalkeeping were big points of emphasis in the offseason for the Skyhawks. UT Martin returns first team All-OVC sophomore Rebecca Starnes to lead the defense. Also returning to the Skyhawk defense are sophomores Kaci Mitchell and Katelyn Colvin.

Sophomore Shannon Grattan begins her career as a Skyhawk after sitting out last year and incoming freshman Bianca McFarland and Alexius Thomas look to add to the depth in the back-end.

Goalkeeping has always been a strong part of the UT Martin soccer program. With the addition of new goalkeepers coach Mary Mancin, the Skyhawks will look to build on their strong tradition at that position. Sophomore MaKenzie Crawford returns after a promising freshman season that included three shutouts. Sophomore Maya Jamison is also back in net for the Skyhawks. Incoming freshman Callie Thomas will be joining the goalkeepers as well.

The OVC appears to be up for grabs this year with several teams losing key players to graduation. Defending champions Murray State were voted as the preseason favorite to win the conference, but McNamara said the championship is there for the taking.

"Like most years in the OVC, it extremely wide open," McNamara said. "Murray State will certainly be near the top, but a few programs have had a good bit of turnover."

During the OVC tournament last year, the Skyhawks suffered a 4-2 first round loss to Morehead State. Having beat the Eagles earlier in the season, youth and inexperience may have gotten the best of the Skyhawks down the stretch. With a year of experience under their belts, the Skyhawks look to be right in the mix to compete for the conference title.

"I don't think we are going to be far off anyone," McNamara said.

"We weren't far off last year, our inexperience just got us in the last game against Morehead State." Something that added to the difficulty of having so many young players a year ago was the lack of home matches to start the year. In 2015, the Skyhawks started the season with eight straight contests away from home. This year is a different story with five of the nine non-conference games taking place at Skyhawk Field. The Skyhawks have been very difficult to beat at home over the course of McNamara's tenure at UT Martin boasting a record of 31-15-6. Having a few more games in front of the home crowd is something that the coaching staff and players are looking forward to.

"Hopefully, with these home games, we can get off to a better start this year," McNamara said. "We want to build a product and be ready for the OVC. It's good to play some games here and typically, in our history, we have been very difficult to beat at home."

2015 SEASON RECAP

AFTER THE GRADUATION OF THE WINNINGEST CLASS IN PROGRAM HISTORY, THE UT MARTIN SOCCER PROGRAM TURNED THE PAGE WHEN THEY TOOK TO THE PITCH IN 2015. THERE WERE MANY SPOTS TO REPLACE INCLUDING THE SKYHAWKS' ALL-TIME WINNINGEST GOALKEEPER, TWO OF THE LONGEST CONSECUTIVE STARTS STREAKS AND A PROLIFIC SCORER WHO SET THE PROGRAM'S SINGLE SEASON GOALS RECORD. THE 2015 SEASON HAD MANY QUESTION MARKS, BUT HEAD COACH PHIL MCNAMARA WAS CONFIDENT THE NEW SQUAD WOULD CONTINUE THE PROGRAM'S SUCCESS.

ROAD TRIPS AIDED IN THE TEAM BUILDING, AS THE SKYHAWKS STUDIED, ATE AND PRACTICED TOGETHER.

THE 2015 CAMPAIGN BEGAN ON THE ROAD AGAINST CONFERENCE USA OPPONENT WESTERN KENTUCKY. WKU WAS A 10-WIN TEAM THE PREVIOUS YEAR THAT RETURNED 10 STARTERS. THE MATCH SAW THE COLLEGIATE DEBUTS OF 11 STUDENT-ATHLETES AS NINE FRESHMEN NOTCHED STARTS. IN THE END, THE SKYHAWKS FELL, BUT WERE ABLE TO SCORE AS SAPHYRA COOMBS-JAMES NOTCHED THE FIRST GOAL IN 2015, LATE IN THE SECOND HALF.

AND HOME FIELD, THE SKYHAWKS LOST TO TROY, SOUTH ALABAMA AND MEMPHIS IN ROUTE TO A FIVE-MATCH LOSING STREAK. MCNAMARA AND THE TEAM BATTLED AND



WHEN THE TEAM OPENED TRAINING CAMP IN EARLY AUGUST, THE SKYHAWKS BEGAN BUILDING A FOUNDATION LIKE OTHER PROGRAMS ACROSS THE COLLEGE LANDSCAPE. MCNAMARA AND HIS STAFF HAD ASSEMBLED THE YOUNGEST TEAM IN DIVISION-I WOMEN'S SOCCER, WITH 15 OF THE 19 STUDENT-ATHLETES COMPETING AS FRESHMEN. THE CAMP WAS CRUCIAL, NOT ONLY TO BUILD TEAM CHEMISTRY BUT TO TEACH PLAYING AND THINKING TECHNIQUE. AFTER A HOME EXHIBITION TO SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE FOE MISSISSIPPI STATE, THE MAJORITY OF THE SKYHAWKS BEGAN THEIR COLLEGIATE CAREERS. WHAT LIED AHEAD FOR UT MARTIN WAS EIGHT CONSECUTIVE ROAD CONTESTS THAT SPANNED ACROSS FIVE STATES AND OVER 1,900 MILES. A DIFFICULT CHALLENGE FOR A VETERAN SQUAD, LET ALONE THE NATION'S YOUNGEST TEAM. THE WEEKEND

JUST TWO DAYS LATER, THE SKYHAWKS GOT THEIR FIRST TASTE OF SUCCESS AGAINST EVANSVILLE. AFTER FALLING BEHIND EARLY IN THE FIRST HALF, UT MARTIN SHOWED VETERAN-LIKE COMPOSURE AS FRESHMAN FORWARD SIERRA FRANZ BEGAN THE COMEBACK WITH A GOAL MINUTES INTO THE SECOND HALF. THAT WAS FOLLOWED UP BY A FREE KICK GOAL FROM FELLOW NEWCOMER AMY MCGIVERN, AND THEN JUST THREE MINUTES LATER, COOMBS-JAMES SEALED THE FIRST SKYHAWK VICTORY WITH A GOAL TO LIFT UT MARTIN TO A 3-2 WIN. COOMBS-JAMES EARNED ADIDAS OVC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK ACCOLADES FOR HER PERFORMANCE. WITH THEIR FIRST TASTE OF VICTORY BEHIND THEM, THE YOUNG SQUAD BEGAN LEARNING THE DIFFICULTY OF A GRUELING ROAD SCHEDULE AS THEY FACED TOUGHER COMPETITION. ON THE ROAD AND AWAY FROM THEIR FAMILIES

WAS STARTING TO SEE THEIR HARD WORK PAY OFF WHEN THEY ARRIVED IN NASHVILLE FOR THE NIKE INVITATIONAL HOSTED BY LIPSCOMB. AFTER FALLING TO WESTERN CAROLINA 3-0, THE SKYHAWKS LOOKED TO BOUNCE BACK AGAINST AKRON. UT MARTIN OPENED THE SCORING IN THE SECOND HALF ON A GOAL FROM FRANZ BUT CONCEDED THE TYING GOAL IN THE 79TH MINUTE ON A CROSS THAT SNUCK BY GOALKEEPER MAYA JAMISON. THE TWO SQUADS HEADED TO OVERTIME WHERE UT MARTIN SHOWCASED THEIR AGGRESSIVE STYLE IN THE 96TH MINUTE. AFTER DRAWING A RED CARD, FRESHMAN MIDFIELDER MAGGIE BURKETT INTERCEPTED AN AKRON PASS AND DELIVERED A THROUGH BALL TO COOMBS-JAMES THAT WAS SLOTTED INTO THE TOP LEFT FOR THE GAME-WINNING GOAL. AFTER THE LONG ROAD TRIP THAT SAW ONLY TWO VICTORIES, THE SKYHAWKS MADE

THEIR HOME DEBUT ON SEPT. 25TH AGAINST CONFERENCE FOE EASTERN ILLINOIS. THE YOUNG UT MARTIN FRESHMEN WASTED LITTLE TIME CONTINUING THE PROGRAM’S TRADITION OF HOME SUCCESS WITH A 3-1 VICTORY AGAINST THE PANTHERS INCLUDING A PAIR OF GOALS FROM FORWARD LISA SCHMIEDER. FRANZ ADDED AN INSURANCE GOAL OFF A QUICK GOAL KICK FROM GOALKEEPER MAKENZIE CRAWFORD. RIDING THE MOMENTUM OF THEIR FIRST HOME VICTORY, THE SKYHAWKS CAPPED OFF THE HOME STAND AGAINST DEFENDING OVC CHAMPION SIUE. IN A CONTEST THAT ONCE AGAINST SAW AN OPPOSITION FULL OF VETERANS, UT MARTIN TIED THEIR BEST START IN OVC PLAY THANKS TO AN OFFENSIVE DISPLAY FROM SCHMIEDER. COOMBS-JAMES SET UP SCMIEDER IN THE 78TH MINUTE OFF A QUICK SKYHAWK COUNTER ATTACK TO NET THE GAME’S ONLY GOAL. IN NET, CRAWFORD NOTCHED HER FIRST OF THREE SHUTOUTS DURING THE 2015 CAMPAIGN, MAKING A CAREER-HIGH 10 SAVES AGAINST THE COUGARS. THE CONFERENCE SLATE THEN CONTINUED ON THE ROAD AGAINST CONFERENCE RIVALS MURRAY STATE, AUSTIN PEAY AND EASTERN KENTUCKY. DESPITE IMPRESSIVE OFFENSIVE STEPS, THE SKYHAWKS RETURNED TO SKYHAWK FIELD IN MID-OCTOBER WITHOUT A WIN AND THEIR CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT DREAMS WERE LOOKING DIM. AS THE LEAVES BEGAN TO CHANGE COLOR, SO TO THE SKYHAWKS YOUNG SQUAD BEGAN SHOWCASING THEIR EXUBERANCE AND

QUALITY THAT HAD LANDED THEM ON THE FIELD. AFTER A 2-0 LOSS TO JACKSONVILLE STATE, THE SKYHAWKS DUG DEEP AND BEGAN THEIR LONGEST UNBEATEN STREAK OF THE SEASON TO PROPEL THEIR POSTSEASON PUSH AND HOPES OF A FIRST ROUND BYE. THE STREAK BEGAN ON SEPT. 18 AGAINST BELMONT WHERE THE SKYHAWKS DOWNED THE BRUINS 3-1 ON GOALS FROM BURKETT, COMBS-JAMES AND FRANZ. BURKETT CONTINUED HER IMPRESSIVE PLAY TO HELP CONTINUE THE UT MARTIN MOMENTUM ON THE ROAD AGAINST TENNESSEE TECH WHERE THE SKYHAWKS PICKED UP THEIR FIRST CONFERENCE ROAD VICTORY. WITH THE SKYHAWKS APPRECIATION FOR WINNING IN DRAMATIC FASHION, UT MARTIN EARNED THE TYING GOAL IN THE 70TH MINUTE THANKS TO SCHMIEDER TO MAKE THE SCORE 1-1. WITH OVERTIME LOOMING AND THE CLOCK TICKING DOWN, BURKETT BECAME THE HERO AS SHE CONNECTED ON A DIVING ATTEMPT IN FRONT OF GOAL TO LIFT UT MARTIN TO A 2-1 VICTORY. THE SKYHAWKS CONTINUED THEIR OVC TOURNAMENT PUSH THREE DAYS LATER WITH A CRUCIAL MATCHUP AGAINST MOREHEAD STATE, A TEAM THAT TRADITIONALLY HAD GIVEN UT MARTIN PROBLEMS. HOWEVER DESPITE BEING ON THE ROAD AND PLAYING FOR THEIR TOURNAMENT LIVES, THE TEAM SHOWED COMPOSURE AND TOOK CONTROL IN THE OPENING HALF. A PAIR OF GOALS WITHIN FIVE MINUTES ON A SUCCESSFUL SCHMIEDER PENALTY KICK AND A BEAUTY PUT HOME BY MCGIVERN AFTER A CRAFTY PASS FROM COOMBS-JAMES PUT THE SKYHAWKS UP FOR GOOD. UT MARTIN CONCLUDED THE REGULAR SEASON AGAINST SOUTHEAST MISSOURI WITH A SCORELESS DRAW. IN THAT CONTEST, THE SKYHAWKS SET A PROGRAM RECORD WITH 42 SHOTS TAKEN. ALTHOUGH THEY FAILED TO GET THE WIN, THE RESULT WAS ENOUGH FOR THE SKYHAWKS TO EARN THE NO. 4 SEED IN THE CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT AND HOST AN OPENING ROUND CONTEST AGAINST RIVAL AND NO. 5 SEED MOREHEAD STATE. ON A COLD, WINDY NOVEMBER AFTERNOON THE SKYHAWKS OPENED THE OVC TOURNAMENT AT HOME FOR THE FIRST TIME SINCE UT MARTIN HOSTED THE CONFERENCE

TOURNAMENT IN 2013. ALTHOUGH UT MARTIN BESTED THE EAGLES IN THE REGULAR SEASON, IT WAS MOREHEAD STATE THAT EARNED THE VICTORY AND ADVANCED IN THE HIGHLY CONTESTED CONTEST. THE SKYHAWKS GAINED THE UPPER HAND IN THE 3RD MINUTE AS MCGIVERN NOTCHED HER THIRD GOAL OF THE SEASON OFF A CORNER KICK SERVED UP BY BURKETT. MOREHEAD STATE THEN ANSWERED WITH A PAIR OF GOALS IN THE FIRST HALF TO TAKE A 2-1 ADVANTAGE INTO THE LOCKER ROOM. LIKE THEY HAD DONE ALL SEASON LONG, UT MARTIN BATTLED THROUGH THE ADVERSITY AND EVENED THE SCORE AT TWO IN THE 50TH MINUTE AS COOMBS-JAMES



SARA KETIS

SCORED HER TEAM-HIGH SEVENTH GOAL OF THE SEASON. ULTIMATELY, THE SKYHAWKS SEASON CAME TO AN END FALLING 4-2. THE SKYHAWKS CONCLUDED THE 2015 SEASON WITH A 7-11-1 RECORD. FOUR PLAYERS EARNED POSTSEASON HONORS FOR THEIR SUCCESS AS BURKETT AND FRESHMAN DEFENDER REBECCA STARNES EARNED ALL-OVC FIRST TEAM HONORS AND ALL-NEWCOMER HONORS. COOMBS-JAMES, WHO LED THE SKYHAWKS IN ALL OFFENSIVE CATEGORIES INCLUDING GOALS (SEVEN), ASSISTS (FIVE), POINTS (19), SHOTS (65), SHOTS ON GOAL (28), EARNED ALL-OVC SECOND TEAM HONORS WHILE FELLOW FORWARD LISA SCHMIEDER EARNED ALL-NEWCOMER ACCOLADES FOR HER SIX GOAL PERFORMANCE.

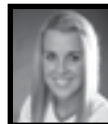

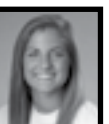

KEVIN McMILLAN

INTERIM ATHLETICS DIRECTOR

APPOINTED: APRIL 7, 2016



Kevin McMillan was appointed interim director of intercollegiate athletics by Chancellor Robert M. Smith on April 7, 2016.

McMillan, 48, completed his seventh season as head coach of the Skyhawk women's basketball program in 2015-16. He will continue his head coaching duties in addition to his role as interim athletic director.

A native of Arkadelphia, Ark., McMillan has created an Ohio Valley Conference women's basketball dynasty at UT Martin, winning eight conference titles (four regular season, four tournament) since 2011. His 142 victories are the most in program history and ranks as the seventh-highest win total in OVC history, as he accounts for three OVC Coach of the Year awards.

McMillan has guided the Skyhawks to six consecutive postseason berths – including the program's first four NCAA Tournament appearances. In 2015-16, he coached UT Martin to its first postseason victory since 1999 with a win at Memphis in the first round of the Women's National Invitation Tournament.

Off the court, McMillan's teams have exceeded the average NCAA Academic Progress Rate in each of his seven seasons. He has produced two OVC Scholar-Athletes (the highest individual honor in the league) and has graduated 100 percent of his student-athletes who have completed their eligibility in his Skyhawk tenure.

McMillan graduated with a degree in math and business from Rhodes College in 1989 and earned his Master's degree in health and human performance from Middle Tennessee State in 2007.

OHIO VALLEY CONFERENCE



Now in its 69th year, the Ohio Valley Conference continues to build on the success that has made it the nation's eighth-oldest NCAA Division I conference.

In May 2011 the Conference expanded for the second time in four years, adding Belmont University which began competition in the 2012-13 academic year. The addition of Belmont gave the OVC 12 members, the most the league has had at one time in its illustrious history. The move added a second team in the city of Nashville and was the first addition to the league since Southern Illinois University Edwardsville joined in 2008. Subsequently, the league has shown its stability over the past decade, seeing only one member institution depart over the past 16 years.

The 2009-10 school year saw a change in leadership as Beth DeBauche was named the seventh full-time Commissioner in league history on July 28, 2009. The last three commissioners of the OVC have moved onto jobs as the commissioner of the Big Ten, Big 12 and the Mid-American Conferences.

The OVC's proud history dates back to 1948, but seeds for the new league were actually planted in 1941. It was then that Roy Stewart, the athletics director at Murray State, the public relations director at Western Kentucky, and Kelly Thompson, the public relations director at Eastern Kentucky, first broached the idea of forming a new conference. Discussions were put on hold by World War II, but reemerged February 27-28, 1948 at the Kentucky Hotel in Louisville as the three original institutions combined with Morehead State, Louisville and Evansville to form the OVC.

In the 1950s, the OVC became a pioneer on a much more significant scale socially. During times of racial segregation, league member Morehead State became one of the first non-traditionally black mid-southern institutions to accept a black student. In 1958 Marshall Banks earned athletically-related aid at Morehead, which signed a second black athlete, Howard Murphy, a year later. In 1961 Murphy earned all-conference recognition as a halfback in football. With racial barriers broken, the rest of the institutions in the league began to provide educational and athletic opportunities to African-Americans.

After Title IX legislation passed in 1972, women's athletics began a rebirth on the national scene as the NCAA began sponsoring and marketing women's sports. Recognizing the need to provide increased opportunities for female athletes, the OVC began formulating plans for women's athletics in 1975 and established women's championships in the sports of basketball, tennis and track in 1977, with cross country and volleyball added over the next four years. Those sports were initially governed by the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW), but the overall strength of women's programs in the league was demonstrated by the automatic bids the OVC instantly received when the NCAA became the governing body in 1982. The conference added women's golf and softball in 1994 and women's soccer in 1998.

Through the past 68 years, 15 teams have won or shared the league's football title. The list is led by Eastern Kentucky, winner of 21 outright or shared football crowns, which is tied for the most in Football Championship Subdivision history (with Massachusetts). Among OVC teams, former member Middle Tennessee is next with 11 titles, followed by Tennessee Tech with 10, and Murray State and former member Western Kentucky with eight apiece. Eastern Illinois has claimed seven football crowns and Jacksonville State has five, while Morehead State, Tennessee State and former members Evansville and East Tennessee State have captured two apiece. Austin Peay, Southeast Missouri, UT Martin and former member Youngstown State have one title apiece.

Murray State and Evansville tied for the initial football championship, and the Racers participated in the first-ever bowl game by an OVC team, tying Sul Ross State 21-21 in the 1948 Tangerine Bowl. From 1948 to 1975, OVC teams played in 15 bowl games, winning eight of them. Eastern Kentucky and Western Kentucky were also participants in the NCAA Division II playoffs in the early and mid-1970s prior to the NCAA's reclassification of football programs into Division I-AA. The term "I-AA" lasted until the end of the 2006 season when it was changed to Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS).

The first Division I-AA/FCS football playoff was held in 1978 with only four teams, which is the only year through present day that the OVC did not field a playoff representative. In 1979, four of the nation's top teams were invited to the playoffs, and two of them - Eastern Kentucky and Murray State - were from the OVC. Murray dropped its semifinal game to Lehigh, but the Colonels nipped Nevada-Reno in double overtime and claimed the national championship a week later with a 30-7 victory over Lehigh. EKV was coached by former All-America quarterback Roy Kidd, who was in his 16th year at the helm of his alma mater and who skipped the Colonels to a second national title three years later. Following the 2002 season, Kidd retired after 39 years at EKV; upon retirement, he ranked sixth all-time among Division I coaches with 315 victories, earning him a spot in the College Football Hall of Fame. EKV's now 21 FCS playoff appearances are the second for the most all-time (behind only Montana's 24 berths).

In addition to Kidd, other coaching legends in the OVC include Charles "Bubber" Murphy, who coached at Middle Tennessee from 1947-1968, Western Kentucky's Jimmy Feix (1968-83), Wilburn Tucker (1954-67) and Don Wade (1968-82) of Tennessee Tech, Bill Ferguson (1967-77) of Murray State, Guy Penny (1959-67) of Morehead State and Boots Donnelly (1977-78 at Austin Peay; 1979-1998 at Middle Tennessee). Following the 2011 season Eastern Illinois head coach Bob Spoo retired after 25 years at the school (the last 16 as members of the OVC). In his time as an OVC coach he compiled 92 total victories (fifth-most in league history) and 68 OVC wins (fourth-most in league history) and was inducted into the OVC Hall of Fame in 2012. In 2016 former Murray State head coach Frank Beamer (1981-86) was inducted into the OVC Hall of Fame; he introduced his wide tackle six defense to the OVC and compiled a 43-23-2 record with the Racers before leaving for his alma mater Virginia Tech where he won 280 games of 29 seasons.

A sampling of former OVC football stars, some of whom were All-Americans during their collegiate careers before achieving stardom at the professional ranks, include Jim Youngblood and Larry Schreiber (Tennessee Tech), Phil Simms (Morehead State), Virgil Livers and Dale Lindsey (Western Kentucky), Myron Guyton and Chad Bratzke (Eastern Kentucky), Cortland Finnegan (Samford) and Tony Romo and Jimmy Garoppolo (Eastern Illinois). In 2008, former Tennessee State standout Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie became just the fourth NFL First Round draft pick in OVC history when he was selected 16th overall by the Arizona Cardinals. He would break into the starting lineup halfway through his rookie season and started at cornerback for the Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII.

The 2007 season marked a return to scholarship football and the OVC for the Austin Peay Governors. Following the 1996 season the Governors dropped scholarship football and competed as both an independent (1997-00, 2006) and as a member of the Pioneer Football League (2001-05).

The 2007 season also brought new vernacular to the Ohio Valley Conference and the division formerly known as I-AA. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game the term I-AA was changed to NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) in a decision by the Division I

Board of Directors. The new label was chosen to communicate in a positive and clear manner the unique differences between Division I football categories (chiefly, the post-season opportunity) while still defining them within the Division I experience. The FCS includes programs that compete in an effort to participate in the NCAA championship postseason structure (one of 90 NCAA national championships) as opposed to the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) which competes in an effort to participate in the postseason bowl system (the 41 NCAA-licensed events which includes the College Football Playoff).

In 2010 Southeast Missouri State, picked to finish seventh in the preseason poll, compiled a 7-1 Conference record on the way to its first OVC Championship since joining the league in 1991. Overall the Redhawks were 9-2 during the regular season and earned a berth in the FCS Playoffs, its first playoff berth at any level in the program's 104-year history. Southeast would lose to eventual national champion Eastern Washington in the second round of the playoffs. Head coach Tony Samuel capped the year by winning the Sports Network's Eddie Robinson Award, given to the National Coach of the Year. Samuel was the second OVC coach to win the award (joining Murray State's Houston Nutt who won the award in 1995).

For only the second time in league history in 2011, three teams shared the OVC football championship, as Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State and Tennessee Tech finished with 6-2 records. The only other time in league history more than two champions were crowned at the end of the year was 1962 (when four teams shared the crown).

In 2012 Eastern Illinois became just the fourth football team in OVC history to go from worst-to-first in winning the OVC Championship. The Panthers were led by head coach Dino Babers who became just the fourth first-year head coach to win an OVC Championship (joining Boots Donnelly in 1977, Jason Simpson in 2006 and Dean Hood in 2008 - Jacksonville State head coach John Grass would become the fifth coach to achieve that feat in 2014). During the year Eastern Illinois junior wide receiver Erik Lora shattered the FCS single-season receptions record, hauling in 136 passes in 12 games; that mark was 13 more than the previous NCAA record and 44 more than the previous OVC mark.

In 2013 Eastern Illinois repeated as OVC Champions behind Walter Payton Award winner Jimmy Garoppolo. The quarterback became just the second OVC player to earn the National Player of the Year Award, joining former EIU signal caller Tony Romo (2002). Garoppolo passed for 5,050 yards (second most in NCAA single-season history) and 53 touchdowns (fourth in NCAA history) in leading the Panthers to a 12-2 record and berth to the quarterfinals of the FCS Playoffs. Garoppolo was drafted by the New England Patriots in the second round of the 2014 NFL Draft, becoming just the fifth OVC player selected in that round and just the fifth OVC quarterback ever selected (and first since 1998).

The 2013 season saw the OVC snap a 19-game playoff losing streak dating back to the 2000 season. Tennessee State shutout Butler (marking the first OVC road playoff victory since 1986) to snap the streak while later that day Jacksonville State smashed Samford in the first round. A week later Eastern Illinois beat Tennessee State while Jacksonville State won at McNeese State to each advance to the quarterfinals; that marked the first time the OVC put two teams in the quarterfinals in the same season since 1991. Overall the four total playoff wins in the same season established a new OVC record.

In 2015 Jacksonville State ascended to No. 1 in both major Top 25 polls, becoming the first OVC team to be ranked No. 1 since the 1999 season. The Gamecocks would go on to complete its second-straight 8-0 Conference mark and won three playoff games to become the first OVC team to advance to the Division I National Championship Game since 1982 (Eastern Kentucky). JSU lost to North Dakota State in the title game but finished the year 13-2 overall and ranked No. 2 in the final Top 25 polls. Head coach John Grass became the first OVC coach honored as the AFCA National Coach of the Year while quarterback Eli Jenkins was named the FCS ADA National Quarterback of the Year, finishing the year with 2,788 passing and 1,161 rushing yards (one of just three Division I quarterbacks - FBS or FCS - to achieve those numbers during the year).

A first in the OVC occurred in 2008, when the league had a first round draft pick in both the NFL (Tennessee State's Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie) and Major League Baseball (Eastern Kentucky's Christian Friedrich) Drafts in the same school year. A year later (2009) the league had a Major League Baseball First Round Compensation Round pick (Eastern Illinois' Tyler Kehrer who was No. 48 overall) and NBA Second Round pick (UT Martin's Lester Hudson) in the same season.

The playing field is not the only place where OVC athletes are working hard. The league also recognizes excellence in the classroom. Six Scholar-Athlete Awards are presented yearly to male and female athletes, while others are commended for their academic success by being Medal of Honor recipients or earning a spot on the Commissioner's Honor Roll. Additionally, the league annually presents one institutional Academic Achievement Award, as well as separate team awards in each Conference-sponsored sport. Since the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-America program began, the Ohio Valley Conference has had 250 student-athletes honored with the award, including 58 over the last six years (2010-16).

Through the early years of the league, administrators wrestled with fan behavior due to the close proximity of the Conference members and the intense rivalries which developed. Just as it did decades ago, the OVC took the leadership role on what has become a national issue. In 1995, the OVC implemented a first-of-its-kind "Sportsmanship Statement," a policy which promotes principles of fair play, ethical conduct and respect for one's opponent. The statement has become a model for others to follow across the nation, and has answered the challenge of the NCAA Presidents Commission to improve sportsmanship in collegiate athletics.

Additionally, the OVC annually presents the Steve Hamilton Sportsmanship Award, in honor of the former Morehead State student-athlete, coach and athletics director, to a junior or senior student-athlete with significant athletic contributions who best exemplifies the characteristics of sportsmanship and citizenship. Most recently, the Conference has also implemented the OVC Institutional and Team Sportsmanship Awards, which are presented to one institution and 18 sport-specific teams voted by their peers to have best exhibited the standards of sportsmanship and ethical conduct as outlined by the OVC and NCAA.

The vision of leadership demonstrated by the Founding Fathers in 1948 remains alive today as the Ohio Valley Conference prepares for the future. One example is in regard to the current trend in collegiate athletics administration for increased involvement of university presidents in setting policies and making rules. The presidents of OVC institutions, however, have always governed the Conference, long before presidential governance became a national theme.

The Ohio Valley Conference sponsors the following sports: baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, tennis and track for men, and basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, tennis, track and volleyball for women. In addition, the OVC also sponsors the combined men's and women's sport of rifle.

Now in its seventh decade of competition, the Ohio Valley Conference has grown significantly from its humble beginnings while increasing the number of athletics opportunities it provides for students. Current league representatives include charter members Eastern Kentucky University, Morehead State University and Murray State University, along with Austin Peay State University, Belmont University, Eastern Illinois University, Jacksonville State University, Southeast Missouri State University, Southern Illinois University Edwardsville, Tennessee State University, Tennessee Technological University and the University of Tennessee at Martin.
